
Bakers Needed!!!

2020 Art Competition Guidelines: Guidelines are in this packet. If you need more, please make additional copies to share with your students.

Kaleidoscope of Gardens: The Troy Garden Club's 46th annual garden walk, this year named *Kaleidoscope of Gardens*, will be on Wednesday, July 8, 2020, rain or shine. **Please encourage your students to enter our 12th annual Garden Walk Art Competition.** In the first 11 years, we awarded approximately \$5000 in prizes. In 2020, we'll award an additional \$400+, all donated by Troy Garden Club members and other interested members of the community.

Art Competition Purpose: Each year the grand prize-winning art becomes the graphic image of our garden walk on 5000 promotional postcards and many posters.

Tenth Year Feature: In addition to the prizes for students, for the tenth year, the garden club will award a cash prize of \$75.00 (donated anonymously) to the art department of the school which submits the largest number of entries.

Promotional Postcard: Enclosed are samples of the promotional postcard that was produced last year using the beautiful painting submitted by Lily Yang, a 10th grader at Troy High School. She was our 2019 grand prize winner of \$100 plus professional framing of her art.

Garden Walk Purpose: The Troy Garden Club plans and sponsors each year's garden walk for the sole purpose of raising funds to support horticulture-related educational activities and opportunities. In 2020 we will donate more than \$8,000 to **30 organizations and individuals.** That amount, generated by our 2019 garden walk, includes tuition scholarships totaling \$2000 to high school graduates who are studying horticulture at a university or technical school.


