

Of the nine books that she has published, she read "Went Out to Get a Donut – Came Home With a Muffin" to each group. Her dynamic presentation style actively engaged the students and taught them the importance of perseverance and that they can all be authors. It was so much fun to hear the students telling her about the books they are publishing during writer's workshop. Laura stayed for Literacy Night where she was able to talk with small groups of students and signed copies of her books. The speech pathologists at the Primary School, Ashley Anderson, Jen Fafinski, and Megan Rhode, in their February newsletter, focused on the language of emotions. The article is relevant for all of our students so I wanted to share it here with you.

In our schools we utilize the <u>Zones of Regulation</u> to teach students to recognize, interpret, and express their emotions. We emphasize that it is okay to have all the feelings and teachers are here to

support students and help them return to a ZONE where they can be successful and learn. For many people, the Green Zone and the Yellow Zone are both effective to be productive learners. Classrooms are equipped with a "check in" system and visuals. The ZONES provide a way for kids to check in with themselves and begin to understand how their bodies respond when they experience different emotions. We use the ZONES language to help children identify and express their emotions. Teachers may use the ZONES language to help students self-reflect on what strategies help them focus in the classroom. As an adult, you may model ZONES language at home by describing how you are feeling and how you are choosing to handle your emotions. At home, this



may sound like, "Phew! I'm feeling hungry and tired right now. My energy is low and I think I am in the Blue Zone. I am going to get a small snack and sit down for a few minutes before I begin my next task." You may also want to model language for your student at home when you notice their emotions. For example, "Hmmm. I notice that you are starting to get frustrated with that game. That feels like a YELLOW Zone emotion, and maybe you want to take a deep breath and walk away for a few minutes? Then we can try again."

Summer School:

Summer School registration is just around the corner (April 1-April 15). Your child's teacher may recommend Getting Ready for Kindergarten, Reading Palooza or a Math Mania class. There are also many other options. Theatre Production: *Cinderella*, Science Fun, Little Yogies (yoga), Lego Mania, Read It, Sing It, Play It, Karate, and Swim Lessons... just to name a few. Summer School is a great way to avoid that "summer slide" in learning. It also keeps the students from getting bored. This year we are offering two 3 week sessions starting on June 22, 8:00-11:00 and three weeks of afternoon sessions. For students currently in 4K or going into 4K in the fall, classes will be held at the Primary School 7:55-10:55. All other classes will be held at the High School. Check out all of the options on the district web site under the parent's home tab, summer school and keep that learning and motivation going!



We reached 100 days of school on Monday, February 10th. Mrs. Mayer's class celebrated with some tower building using100 cups.






e were very lucky to have Author Laura Eckroat meet with Lodi Primary and Elementary students throughout the day. She talked about her journey as an author.
