<b>MDE Meeting</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Review Resolution of Concurrence 2019 items and how the District 196 and Indian Education Program has or has not fulfilled them.</li> <li>• Resolution of Concurrence 2019 items include</li> </ul> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>Indian Ed staffing needs:</b> Indian Ed staffing needs- Indian Ed was able to hire PT Cultural Advocate Fonda Smith.</li> <li>2. <b>Provide elementary school based cultural events and activities:</b> Indian Ed continued to do classroom presentations from AI staff. Shared resources with teachers, shared the Ojibwe and Dakota learning trunks throughout the district and created a Native lending library for educators throughout the district. Increased our monthly book club to 59 elementary students this school year.</li> <li>3. <b>Provide teachers with training in Ojibwe culture and language:</b> Teacher trainings included Mni Sota Makoce training with Dr. Darlene St. Clair, Grassroots Indigenous Media with Mary Hermes, Dr. John Gonzalez, Promising intervention to empower successful AI students. Continue to work with the district and the 2nd grade Ojibwe unit and 4th grade Dakota unit.</li> </ol>

	<p>4. <b>Propose Ojibwe language as a language class offering perhaps through Distance Education:</b> Looking into a possible collaboration with other south metro Indian Ed programs, Ojibwe language program available on MN Online program for grades 7-12, could possibly look into community education, would need instructors.</p> <p>5. <b>Continue ACT prep, college visits for high school juniors and seniors, middle school mentoring program, high school check ins, focus groups and cultural activities:</b> 5 ACT Prep students, 9 high school tutoring, doing college campus visits for 4 schools. Also have middle school mentorship and council of indigenous youth.</p> <p>6. <b>Continue to utilize parents as partners in providing relevant cultural and academic activities</b></p> <p>7. <b>Continue to focus on hiring a culturally divers workforce that matches the students we serve (District Goal)</b> Will get open ISD196 job openings on the Indian List Serv</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Vote passed with recommendations to present on February 10<sup>th</sup>, School Board Meeting Dakota Ridge at 6pm.</li> <li>• Recommendations include: Elementary academic support and educational coaching, parent trainings, provide American Indian teacher trainings, &amp; continue efforts to hire culturally diverse staff throughout 196 to meet the needs that Indian Ed serves.</li> </ul>
