Mumps Alert

A parent has reported to us that they have mumps. We wanted to inform you because mumps is a risk to pregnant women. If you suspect any member of your family has mumps, please consult with your GP and inform the school straight away. Anyone with suspected mumps must stay away from school. The symptoms are swelling of the parotid glands located in either side of the face, just below your ears. Both glands are usually affected by the swelling, although sometimes only one gland is affected. The swelling can cause pain, tenderness and difficulty with swallowing.
