UNIFROG

A reminder that all students in Year 9 and above at Mayfield have access to the award-winning online careers platform, Unifrog. Girls in Year 9 and all girls in Years 10 and 12 who are new to Mayfield have now received their login details. Training will follow.

Unifrog is a valuable part of the careers education programme in place at Mayfield, bringing together every undergraduate university course, apprenticeship, and college course in the UK, as well as other opportunities, such as School Leaver Programmes, MOOCs and every college at Oxford and Cambridge, making it easy to compare and choose university courses, apprenticeships or further education courses. Students can also explore exciting opportunities further afield by looking at English-taught undergraduate programmes available in Europe, Canada, the USA and Asia.

The platform also contains comprehensive on-line libraries, which can be searched by career, subject, themes or competencies. Additionally, the platform allows pupils to log experiences and evidence skills, and older students can use it for support with writing personal statements, applications and CVs.

HOSPITAL WORK EXPERIENCE
