We celebrated National Poetry Day last week, at Aldro, in a variety of ways. This year, the theme was "Change" and the boys had great fun in their English lessons, experimenting with different ways to perform poetry on this subject. They practised working in pairs and groups to share performance ideas as well as performing as a whole class. It was a teambuilding exercise as well as helping them to gain in confidence. The boys also enjoyed writing a wide range of poetry. 
Form 7 trip to see "Private Peaceful"



On Tuesday 9th October, Form 7 set off to the New Victoria Theatre, Woking, to see a performance of "Private Peaceful". The boys have been reading Michael Morpurgo's novel in their English lessons this term, as a part of our commemoration of the centenary of the end of the First World War and the English Department leapt at the opportunity to take their teaching groups to see the novel adapted for theatre. The actor portraying Tommo Peaceful brought the story to life by using props, lighting, costumes, a variety of accents and of course there were sound effects too, which, in particular, helped to create the atmosphere of chaos and terror on the battlefield. He conveyed the ups and downs of Tommo's story - of his childhood, family life, relationship with his brothers, friendships, adolescence and eventual journey to the battlefields of World War 1, in a range of tender, emotional and hard hitting ways, which had the audience transfixed. Although not advertised as a monologue, the story was brought to life very effectively, by being adapted for the stage in this way. The versatile and talented actor who played Tommo ensured that the story and themes of the play were accessible to an audience of a range of ages. Most importantly, we were all reminded of the immeasurable sacrifice of those whose lives were changed for ever by the First World War.

The 1st XI football team, led by Theo put in some superb performances this season and got the results they deserved. There was some excellent attacking play, numerous skilful goals and many strong defensive performances.

The season began slowly, with the boys despite a 4-3 win in their first match against Feltonfleet taking a while to get their season started. Three defeats and a penalty shootout loss followed but the boys refused to give up and turned their season around, starting at home to Shrewsbury House. Aldro ran out 2-1 winners having dominated play and restricted Shrewsbury to minimal chances, and the confidence increased from there. Lambrook, Hawthorns and Parkside were the next three teams to be defeated by Aldro 1st XI, all within a week, with the boys enjoying their new 5-3-2 formation. The last Wednesday of the football season saw a 1-1 draw against Hoe Bridge, a highly competitive match which included a Hoe Bridge penalty miss in the final minutes.

A run in the Surrey Cup Plate allowed the Aldro boys a few extra games, reaching the semi-finals at the time of writing, with the IAPS 6-a-side tournament an overall success, winning the plate competition. The boys narrowly missed out on a place in the main competition, and securing a spot at Nations, due to a loss early in the day. But three wins from five matches ensured a good afternoon for the boys, supported by many parents on the side lines, with a couple of particularly outstanding goals scored against Solefield School.


