



Aldro says goodbye to staff




Charity News—Ironman in aid of Dusty Yak Foundation



I spent a week there in May, partly out of my own personal interest, but also to work for Mr and Mrs Hurley, completing a review of the educational provision the 11 girls are receiving. I spent a day in their school, observing lessons and meeting their teachers, as well as a day in two other schools comparing them. In addition to this, I sat in on all the activities that the girls are given the opportunity of, from karate, to music, dance to tutoring and managed to fit in a little bit of sight-seeing too. I was taken to the orphanage that the girls came from before moving to Dusty Yak and visited a government funded baby orphanage too. All I can say is, the money that is being raised to support this charity is so needed. Even a few pounds can make such a huge difference. It was an honour to visit, and I can't wait to go again!

This year the Form 3 boys have worked hard on PENPALS, developing card pen pots, with an initial prototype using paper and scissors, followed by second card prototype using craft knives, safety rules and cutting mats, and finally their finished product cut by the CAMM1 following the CAD design they have created on the computers.

They also worked really hard In a Textiles project, developing their sewing skills to be able to sew on their own badges. They put these sewing skills to great use creating this farewell gift for Mrs Rush.



The boys in Form 4 were very excited about using these completed name plaques in the locker rooms this term.

They all designed their own font, and created a personalised logo on CAD, using the CAMM1 vinyl cutter to create the vinyl 'Stika's' TM. These were applied to the forex backing plate they added a magnetic strip so that they fix onto the metal lockers.



Form 5 delighted many Dads this year with their combined Food Technology and Graphics project for Father's Day. With great support from our 2 celebrity Chefs (Mr David McCoy and Mrs Maddie Hatton) the boys created Scoffins, Flapjacks and Rocky Roads which they then packaged in their own packaging design. They particularly enjoyed the nutritional analysis and evaluation lesson at the end when they got to taste the fruits of their labours, as it would seem did our assistant Chef, Mr Cope!

In the spring term all the Form 6 boys worked collaboratively to produce a dazzling array of over 40 pieces of sparkly giant cutlery for our amazing Beauty and the Beast show.

They made small prototype versions to start with to develop the skills involved with using templates and scalpel blades, as well as spray mounting. They then set to creating large MDF templates, constructing a giant spray booth and batch producing all the props to wow the audience!

Their most recent project has been aluminium keyfobs and pendant necklaces, which will be on display in the DT cabinet at the start of the new term.





The Design and Technology department is incredibly proud of what every Aldro boy has achieved in DT this year, but a special mention has to go to an extraordinary young man who had received the ultimate accolade for his talents in this subject. We are delighted to formally congratulate Max on his amazing achievement in being awarded a Design and Innovations scholarship at Charterhouse. Max took along a bulging portfolio of work from in and out of school and clearly wowed them with his passion for DT at the interview. We wish Max the very best and look forward to hearing lots from him in the future and seeing what he produces in the years to come.



Max had this to say about the scholarship:-

For my DT scholarship portfolio I put together a range of different items to showcase all of the DT things I have done over the years. This included: 2 photobooks, 2 architectural projects, A sketchbook of future projects and My Aldro DT folder.

In addition to my DT class work I had to show all the work I had done outside of lesson time. One photobook showed the products I made in 2016 and before and the other featured the things I made in 2017. These included photos of each creation and what it was about, for example; the type of market/ consumer the product aimed at and how I made it. I also included 2 architectural projects, these were about replacing the garage at my house and building a new one, this project was done in detail and could be given to a builder to build. The other architectural project was about totally redesigning our garden; this was in a similar format. Finally my portfolio concluded with a sketch book with some products that I am planning to build in the future.

On the day the other 3 shortlisted candidates and I went to Charterhouse's DT centre for a quick build and an interview. For the quick build we all had to build a bird feeder that met some specific requirements for example, it had to be easily accessible and easily refillable.

2 weeks later I received the letter informing me that I got the scholarship!
