



Dear Friends.

Last weekend, I announced at each of the Masses how we will use the \$23,000 we received after surpassing our CSA target for this past year.

We are going to make some updates in order to have our church more accessible for people who are using wheelchairs, walkers, canes, and crutches. This is the

list of improvements we have to date.

We will have the side door entering the Gathering Space near the handicapped parking spots open automatically by pressing a handicap "Push to Open" button. The same will be true for the door for the handicapped bathroom.

We will also be taking out the second to the last pew in front of the Cry Room. This will allow those who wish to sit near the back in a wheelchair to have that option. We will continue to have the space in the front pew next to Mary's altar for those who are using wheelchairs.

If you can think of any other improvements in order to make our church a more welcoming "user-friendly" church, please let me know.



FASTING & ABSTINENCE:

According to Canon law and the U.S. Bishops, rules are as follows:

- Every person **14 years of age or older** must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and every Friday during Lent.
- ♦ Every person between the **age of 18 and 59** (beginning of 60th year) must **fast** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When **fasting**, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are <u>not equal</u> to a full meal, according to Canon law & the U.S. Bishops.

ALMSGIVING:

- Give to the St. Vincent de Paul Poor Box located on the back wall of the church.
- ◆ Donate to Divine Child's annual Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) collection.
- Volunteer your time at a local soup kitchen or other charitable organization.





HOLY ST. JOSEPH! Was St. Joseph a Knight of Columbus???


With today's societal pressures, men are finding it difficult to understand what "today's man" is supposed to be. Who are we as men; and more importantly, who are we as CATHOLIC men? Let us look to St. Joseph as a model. We can learn a lot from one of the most important persons in the Gospels whose words were never recorded. This Thursday, March 19th, we celebrate the Feast of St. Joseph.

St. Joseph is the foster-father of Jesus and chaste spouse of our Blessed Mother. As men, as husbands, as fathers, when we look to Joseph we can empathize, but never fully comprehend his trials. He is betrothed to a woman who becomes pregnant; what social and personal stigma must he have had to deal with? He is visited by angels on numerous occasions and always obeys their directions. His task is to protect God and the Godbearer, not an easy job when the king is set on killing your child! Two thousand years ago, culture and society had its pressures just as it has its grip on men today. St. Joseph listened to his faith, to God and to His angels and did not give in to the pressures of the culture.


We are often reminded of the fiat of Our Blessed Mother, her saying "yes, let it be done to me" to the Holy Spirit, and allowing herself to become the vessel of which our God becomes man in our Lord Jesus. But let us also remember the "yes" that St. Joseph responds with to the Angel of the Lord, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home. (MT 20-24). Throughout the short Joseph narrative, he continues to say "yes" and obey God for the safety and protection of his family. Here are some points taken from Fr. Jim Bilot's talk last year:

Protector: Man is called to protect. Protect his family of course, but also protect the gifts God has given him. These gifts should be secured to be used for the glory and honor of God and not to advance the decline and degradation of our society. Provider: More than just a provider of material needs, but the one who contributes to the spiritual nourishment of our loved ones and those around us. Studies show that 67-75% of children who see their fathers go to Mass and pray are more likely to attend church as an adult. Isn't that an important tradition we should pass on to our children? Chaste Love: Although we want to think only of chastity and celibacy, it is much more. Chaste love is a deep commitment to one's calling, whether it is in marriage, priest or religious life or as a single person. It is being in tune with the covenant that God calls us to be in. **Obedience:** One of the hardest virtues of manhood. It is so easy for a man to want only to be obedient to himself, yet it is humility that allows us to become obedient to God our Father! Man of Action: We are called as men to be a "doer of the Word;" that is, to go out and live the Gospel of Jesus, to preach by actions while not having to say a word.

One of the many gifts that your Foley Knights offer the parishioners of Divine Child is the Building Domestic Church Kiosk near the exit doors of the Gathering Room. These books are free of charge to those who wish to take one and delve deeper into their faith. There are three books specifically dealing with St. Joseph Our Father in Faith, The Gift of Fatherhood and Becoming a Real Man of God. I would encourage all men to take one and grow deeper in your faith to be a stronger Catholic man.



Archdiocesan News

Dear Fathers, Devoted Religious, and Brothers and Sisters in Christ.



Over the last couple of years, as I continue to ask the Holy Spirit to guide us in our work to unleash the Gospel, I have been drawn often to a thought that Pope Francis expresses

in his work on evangelization, Evangelii Gaudium. He observes that expressions of popular piety – such as Novenas, pilgrimages to shrines, and other observances – often provide the faithful an opportunity to be missionaries: sharing their faith by inviting their family, friends and neighbors to participate with them in their favorite devotions. Our Holy Father exhorts forthrightly: "Let us not stifle or presume to control this missionary power! . . . Underlying popular piety, as a fruit of the inculturated Gospel, is an active evangelizing power which we must not underestimate: to do so would be to fail to recognize the work of the Holy Spirit" (§124, 126).

It is in this context that I joyfully share with you the news of the establishment of **St. Joseph Oratory in Detroit as an Archdiocesan Shrine.** Over the ages, countless men and women have flocked to St. Joseph – the patron of fathers, workers, and indeed of the whole church – and found him to be a constant and reliable friend and protector. With this designation, we recognize and celebrate the reality that the St. Joseph Shrine has been and will continue to be a sacred place of pilgrimage, a source of deep devotion to St. Joseph, and a welcoming place of rich liturgical life for all the faithful. More information about this special designation is provided in the accompanying announcement from the Archdiocese of Detroit.

Having witnessed the vibrant renewal taking place under the pastoral care of the Canons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest over the course of the last three years, I am grateful for the fervor and commitment of the priests and parishioners. It has become clear to me that souls are flocking to St. Joseph Shrine to be invigorated spiritually through the liturgical life there, expressed in the extraordinary form of the liturgy, and through the numerous devotions offered, including the perpetual Novena to St. Joseph each Wednesday.

In celebration of this occasion, I invite all members of the faithful to join me at 5 p.m. March 19 at St. Joseph Shrine, 1828 Jay Street in Detroit, as I read the official decree and subsequently lead the parish community, pilgrims, and all the faithful in an annual St. Joseph Day procession through the surrounding Eastern Market neighborhood. After the procession, at 7:00p.m., a Solemn High Mass in the Extraordinary Form will be offered at the Shrine.

It is fitting that this designation comes during the 150th year of St. Joseph's patronage of the Universal Church, as decreed by His Holiness, Pope Pius IX. As with the recent news about the Basilica of Ste. Anne, I hope that this recognition will stir up in our hearts a renewed commitment to the friendship in Christ we share with the saints, and challenge each of us to consider how we can deepen and foster these friendships.
