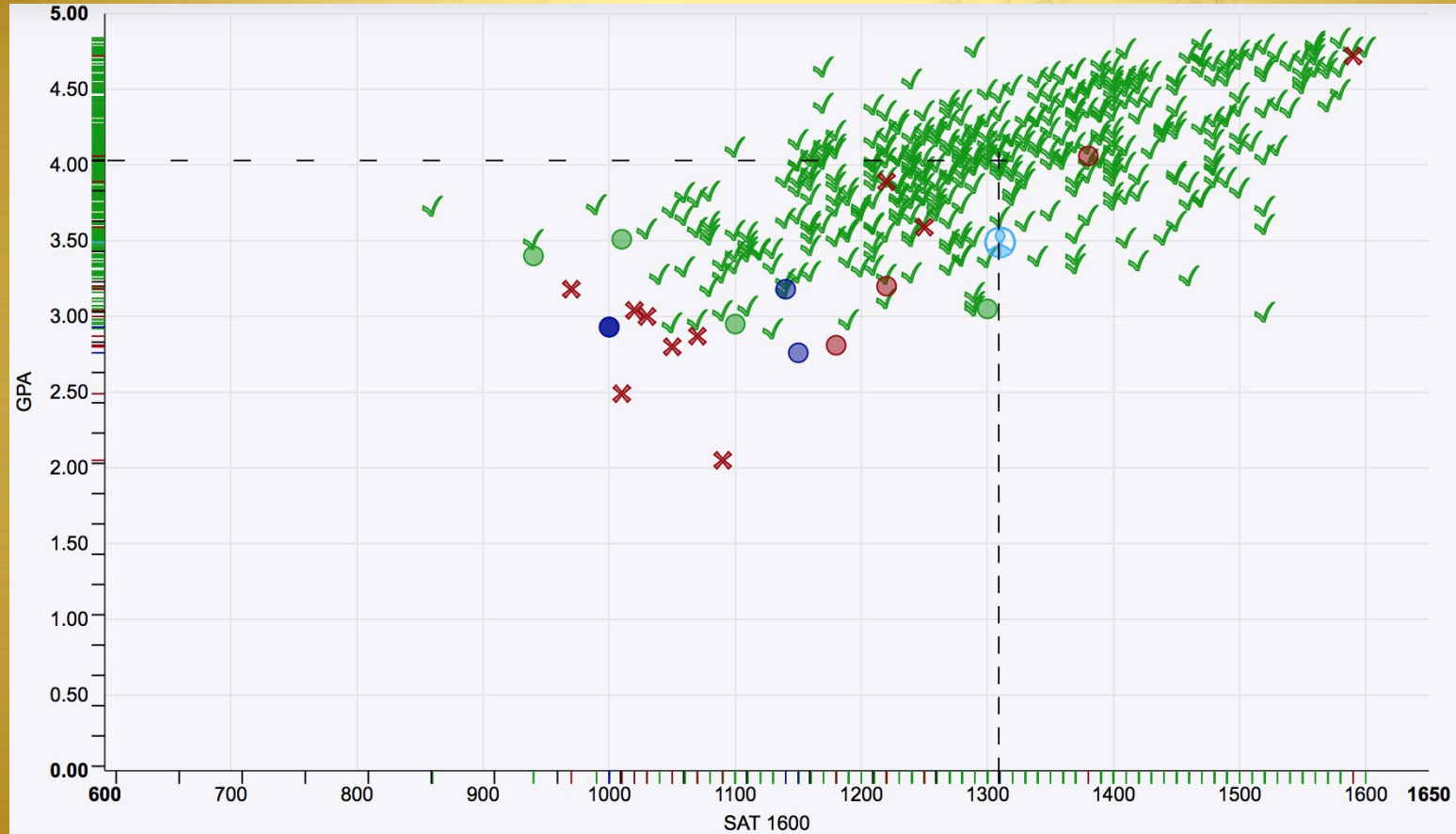
Requirements for Admission: Apply by 11/1 for best consideration; look at challenging coursework and top grades and test score; Early Action Notification: Mid-Dec OR Regular notification: March; does not accept October ACT to complete application for Early Action; 2 majors are strongly encouraged (including Undeclared) on application

Application Process: School specific app or coalition application. Self-report grades on application; essay(s) used for admission, honors program and scholarships; DO NOT SEND RECs - will be shredded if sent! Apply directly to college and major; each college has own set of admission requirements; must stay in admitted major for one academic year (apply to internally transfer at end of frosh year); 25% of frosh start as Undeclared (Division of General Studies); several majors in Engineering and some performance majors not allowed as "second choice" majors due to space constraints, recalculated GPA off of sophomore and junior year.

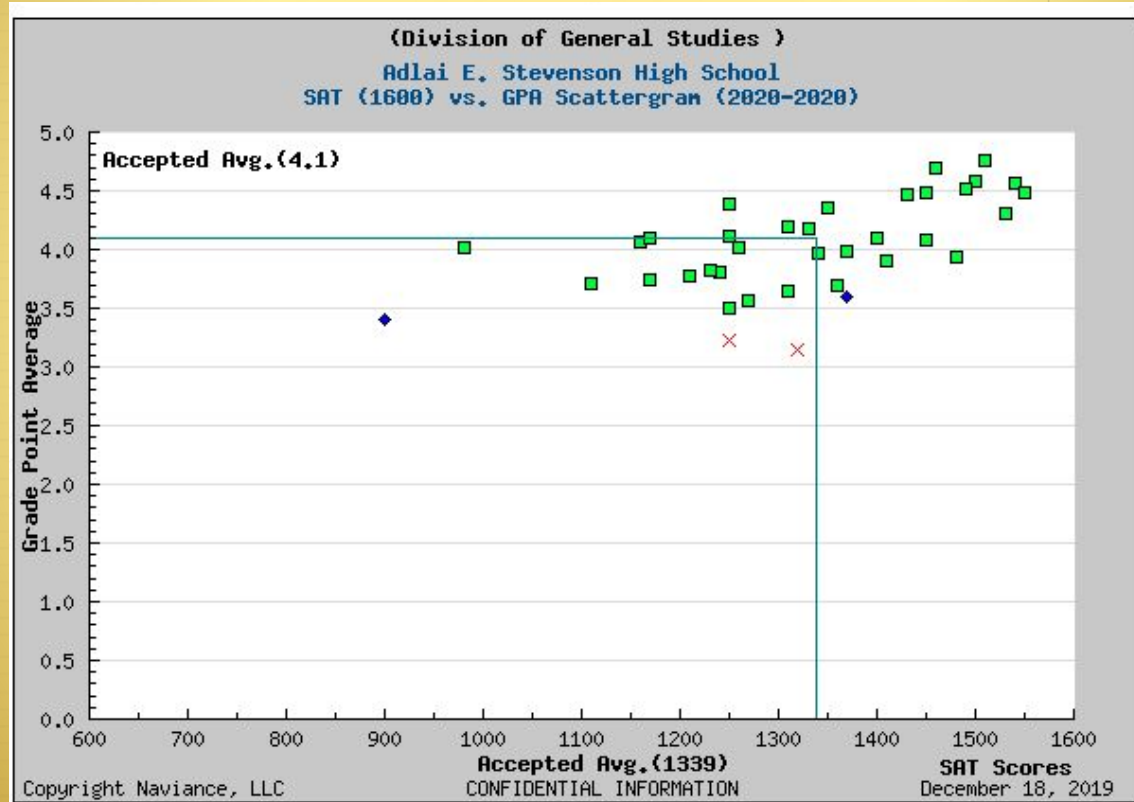





Overview

There are many challenging educational and training opportunities within the high-skilled world of Business Management and Administration. Learners need a solid background in math, science and technical skills. Education and training can be obtained in high schools, technical colleges/institutes, and universities. Along the way, career guidance professionals assist learners in assessing their educational goals, interests, abilities and skills to facilitate a good match to the cluster's many pathway options. Learners participate in relevant educational opportunities framed in the context of the cluster. They gain knowledge and skills through coordinated workplace learning experiences such as site visits, job shadowing and internships. If they choose, they may achieve valuable skill certifications that lead to employment. Colleges and universities offer advanced degrees and industry certifications that prepare learners for professional and technical careers. The Business Management and Administration Cluster prepares learners for careers in planning, organizing, directing and evaluating business functions essential to efficient and productive business operations. Career opportunities are available in every sector of the economy and require specific skills in organization, time management, customer service and communication.

Employment Outlook

Nearly half of all jobs are in managerial and professional occupations, and nearly one-fourth of all workers are self-employed. The business management and administration services industry is one of the highest paying industries. Most job openings in the business management and administration cluster are projected to be in occupations assigned to the administrative support pathway. Including customer service representatives, the occupation expected to have the largest number of job openings in the cluster.

Why is Career Exploration important?

Why is career exploration important?

Students who choose majors that are a good fit based on their interests have higher GPAs at college, are less likely to change their majors, and are more likely to persist in college and complete their degrees in a timely manner.

Studies show that individuals who develop career navigation knowledge and skills are more likely to:

- Have expanded education and career opportunities
- Make education and career decisions that better fit them
- Increase their motivation to learn and achieve
- Experience more positive outcomes in both school and work settings

The goal of early career exploration is to encourage students to attach *value* to their interests and create a sense of *purpose* for their post-secondary experience! (college or otherwise)

Having an *“initial” road map*, (a career road map) creates confidence and a sense of direction.

The “navigation” may change slightly...

But having *some direction* is better than no direction at all!

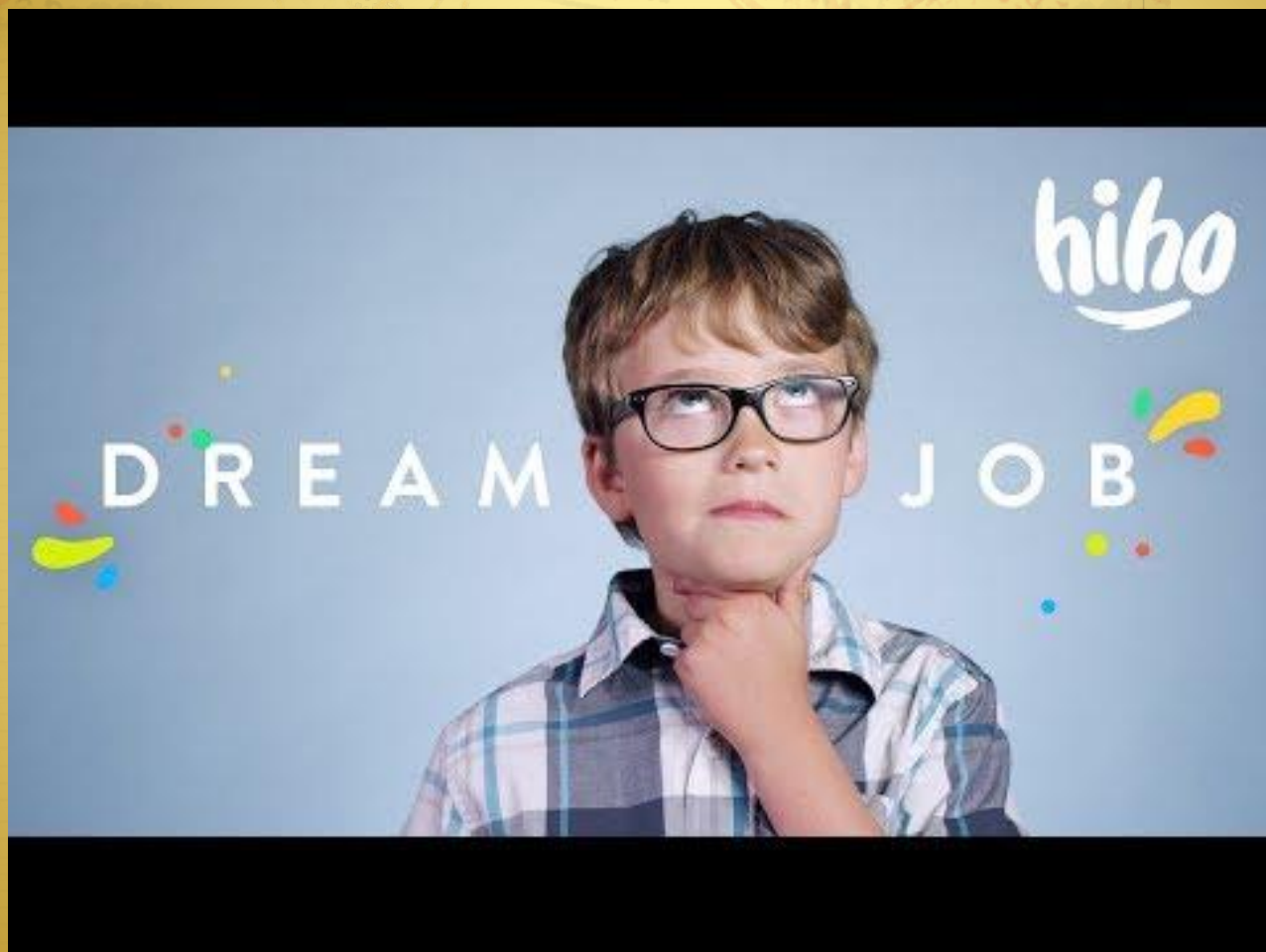
