

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CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION

Students that receive the General Education Certificate of Completion from Weber State can present it to any State of Utah public college or university and students to have the required general education classes waived at that school.

- Students must pass all AP exams with a 3, 4, or 5 to earn credit and those credits must be submitted to Weber State.
- Any transfer credits would need to be submitted to Weber State.






