
The PB&J scholarship awards students who have experienced challenges in their life that may not have allowed them to perform well academically but still have the drive to succeed.

The Lilly Kaighin Community Service Award. This award is given to a 12th grader (senior who has seen a need in the community and has created and implemented an original community service project to meet the identified need. This \$1,000 award will be presented to the winner in April 2020.

The Teeja Service through the Arts Award. This award is given to a 12th grader (senior) who has seen a need in the community and through volunteer activities and/or an original project has used service through the arts to meet the identified need. The \$1,000 award will be presented to the winner in April 2020.

Freeman Orthodontics Inspiration Awards are given to two high school seniors who have inspired others by overcoming unique and challenging circumstances while remaining in school and maintaining or improving his/her academic achievement. 

PAY ATTENTION

Paying Attention Can:

Improve Memory- If you start paying attention more often in your life, you will soon notice you remember many more details than usual.

Increase Your Patience- take a break, slow down and pay attention to the world around them. Doing that, you become wiser, more rational and can problem solve to find solutions.

Do Things More Thoroughly- If you pay attention to details, you will stop making small mistakes, and begin fulfilling your duties more thoroughly than before.


Improve Interpersonal Relations- Paying attention to what people are telling you is the best way to improve interpersonal relations.

Allow You Start Noticing Opportunities- If you are careful enough to pay attention to all details during conversations with other people, you may begin noticing valuable opportunities.

Mental Health

How to Strengthen Your Attention Span:



Practice real-life attention exercises. For instance, you can take a photo full of small details and watch it for a few minutes. Pay attention to all people and objects in this photo. When you stop looking at it, try to remember as many details as possible.

Meditate- With the stress and decision overload of work duties and everyday life, it seems it is increasingly difficult to stay focused on anything for too long. You can find a cure for this problem in meditation. You do not have to be a pro at it – just relax through meditation two or three times a week and it will make you more comfortable soon enough.

Listen to Understand- Interpersonal relations suffer if you do not pay enough attention to what other people are saying. To avoid this issue, try to speak less than usual and start listening to the people around you.


5 RULES TO STAY SAFE



SAFETY RULE #1

- Be aware of situations in your environment and people around you that may not be safe, both online and off.
- Stay with a friend at all times, and memorizing your parents' and Safe Adults' cell phone.
- When you are aware, you are empowered, and less likely to be victimized.

SAFETY RULE#2





SAFETY RULE #3

Using good decision making skills to respond to new or unsafe situations, both online or off. You can Make a Move by: getting away from unsafe situations or people, or by staying away from people and situations you know are unsafe. It also means helping a friend out of an unsafe situation, whether they recognize it's unsafe or not.

SAFETY RULE #4

You have the right to be safe and knowing you can use a strong or assertive voice if you or others are in an unsafe situation, online or off.

Talk It Up

- You can Talk It Up by saying "No" to someone who is violating your personal boundaries, or someone who is demonstrating unsafe or inappropriate behaviors to you or others.
- It also means telling (or reporting) a Safe
 Adult about unsafe or inappropriate
 situations or behaviors. Not telling, to avoid
 being seen as a "snitch," allows problems to
 continue to grow and may cause more
 damaging long-term consequences.



SAFETY RULE #5

- As you get older, you will encounter new people and situations and will make decisions about your own behavior. No matter what happens, it is important to know you should never feel ashamed to seek help and talk to a Safe Adult if you are unsafe or have been hurt.
- You are not to blame and it is never too late to tell. It's also important to know that if you have made an unsafe or inappropriate decision, talking to a Safe Adult can help you learn and stay safe.
