We appreciate the cooperation you have shown regarding the handicap spaces by keeping them open and available for those that need to use them. Thank you.


If you know of any military members that are interested in becoming teachers, please pass along the information in this newsletter. There will be a meeting with more information for them next Tuesday the 28th.
