

~ Delayed Openings ~



Schools now have two options for a delayed start to the school day!
We will announce either a 2-hour delay or a 3-hour delay for the morning arrival.

3-Hour Delay: In the case of the 3-hour delay, the scheduled bus pick up times will simply be 3 hours after the normal pick up time. Also, when the schools have a 3-hour delay, preschool and prekindergarten classes will be cancelled for the day. Adding the extra delay time may allow us to avoid the need to cancel school after early morning storms.

2-Hour Delay: In the case of the 2-hour delay, the scheduled bus pick up times will simply be 2 hours after the normal pick up time. Also, when the schools have a 2-hour delay, AM preschool and AM pre-kindergarten classes will be cancelled.

All end-of-day dismissal times will be at the regularly scheduled times.

2020 CENSUS AND GROTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Every ten years the federal government conducts a census or counting of the people that reside in the country. This has been going on since 1790 when Thomas Jefferson conducted the first census of the newly created country. This year residents will receive an invitation to respond to the census in mid-March. The Town and City of Groton as well as our partners at the Submarine Base have been working together to get the message out that we need you to respond to the census request.

How does the census impact education? Did you know that the federal grant money goes towards Special Education funding, Title I grants, the National School Lunch Program, Head Start and Foster Care to name a few? It is **so important** for everyone to respond to the census. Groton's children are depending on your response to make sure these and other federal programs are fully funded.

The power of the complete count of Groton's population is in YOUR HANDS. You will be receiving an invitation in the mail to respond to the census in mid-March. It is **easy** to respond. You can do it either online, by phone or in writing. Your information is **safe** as the Census Bureau is not permitted by law to share any of your information with anyone including law enforcement and other government agencies.

The Groton Public Library, the Mystic-Noank Library and the Bill Memorial Library will be hosting a Census Kick-off Celebration on April 1. If you do not have computer access, here is a perfect opportunity for you. The public access television channels are holding different shows intended to give information to the residents of Groton. Check out the Facebook page for the Town of Groton's Complete Count Committee which is now up and running. Posters are on display around town. Flyers and handouts will be coming home as well. World Autism Awareness Day

In 2007, the United Nations General Assembly declared April 2 as World Autism Awareness Day (WAAD), with the goal of bringing the world's attention to autism, a pervasive disorder that affects tens of millions.

World Autism Awareness Day shines a bright light on autism as a growing global health concern. WAAD activities help to increase and develop world knowledge of the autism crisis and impart information regarding the importance of early diagnosis and early intervention. Additionally, WAAD celebrates the unique talents and skills of people with autism, and features community events around the world where individuals with autism and their families are warmly welcomed and embraced.

Autism

Autism, or autism spectrum disorder (ASD), refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication. According to the Centers for Disease Control, autism affects an estimated 1 in 59 children in the United States today. (When we first started participating in this event in 2014, the statistic was 1 in 110 children.)
