Celebrating Seventy Years of Catholic Education

In 1944, Bishop Peter Ireton saw the need for a centrally located high school serving Norfolk's Catholic community. In 1950, Norfolk Catholic High School opened its doors with a student body of 305 and a faculty of 17 nuns. Priests served as principals and religion teachers. The curriculum was college preparatory and academic standards were high.



In 1993, because of changing demographics, Catholic High School was established in Virginia Beach. In 2020, seventy years after opening,



Catholic High has a student body of 413 students. Over the years, dedicated lay people have replaced the religious faculty. We remain focused on a college preparatory curriculum and academic standards continue to soar.

We celebrate this tradition of excellence and continue the mission of educating young men and women in the Catholic faith.

On Thursday, March 26, The Most Reverend Barry C. Knestout, Bishop of the Diocese of Richmond, will visit the school and celebrate Mass with our community to mark the occasion.


By providing Catholic High School students with an academically rigorous and doctrinally sound education, we ensure that they have the foundation to live a morally upright life in our complex, modern world.

A charitable remainder trust might be your answer. A charitable remainder trust gives the donor a payment for a set term of years or for life, with the remaining trust property passing to Catholic HIgh School.

In many cases, a planned gift enables you to make a significantly greater contribution than would be possible through an outright gift. CHARITABLE IRA ROLLOVER

Changes Under The Secure Act Impact the Required Minimum Distribution for Individual Retirement Accounts

Beginning in 2020, the new age at which Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) must start is age 72 with a deadline of April 1 of the following year. It should be noted that RMDs for individuals who turned 70 1/2 in 2019 are not delayed, and instead, such individuals must continue to take their RMDs under the same rules. Federal legislation passed by Congress in 2015 allows account holders who make a contribution directly from a traditional IRA to a qualified charity can donate up to \$100,000 without it being considered a taxable distribution.

Despite the delay in the starting age for RMDs, Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs) from IRAs will not be affected. QCDs may still be taken from IRAs as early as age 70 1/2.

Obtain a Letter of Intent from the Advancement Office at Catholic High School.

Also, obtain the Virginia Department of Education Preauthorization Form.

Send the completed Letter of Intent and Preauthorization Form to MPSF.

who will submit your Preauthorization Form by secure electronic dropbox to the VA DOE for approval of your Tax

Within approximately 7-10 days, the DOE will send you an Approval Letter indicating your tax credits have been reserved for a period of 180 calendar days.

Return the Signed Approval Letter with your check or securities transfer information to MPSF within 180 days of the date of the notice.

(Preauthorizations become void after 180 days). Make checks payable to the McMahon Parater Scholarship Foundation.

After you have made your donation...

Within 40 days of receiving your gift, MPSF will:

- Send you an acknowledgment of receipt of your gift
- Send the DOE a notice that your gift payment has been received
- Notify the designated school(s) that your gift has been received

Within 30 days, the DOE will issue your Tax Credit Certificate.

- The Tax Credit Certificate must be attached to the tax return in which the credits are being claimed.
- Tax credits may be claimed for the taxable year of the donation, and for up to five successive years.







As student leaders, they attend monthly committee meetings, work on committee projects, and coordinate historic preservation advocacy in our school.



On Monday, October 7, Congressman Bobby Scott hosted a Community Forum Honoring Hispanic Heritage Month at Old Dominion University. Crusader Cynthia Vallés was invited to say the Pledge of Allegiance at the beginning of the forum.



The Freshmen class conquered the Penny Wars! Thanks to all who played and donated, we have raised over \$900 toward our goal of purchasing Elkay Water Bottle fountains for the school! The Freshmen earned 2 dress down days for having the most points and donating the most money of any class.

Thirteen of our students participated in the William and Mary Model UN. They represented several countries including Bulgaria, Slovenia, Malaysia, Mexico and China. Model United Nations, also known as Model UN or MUN, is an extra-curricular activity in which students roleplay delegates to the United Nations and simulate UN committees.





Our AP Environmental Science students attended a Roundtable Discussion on Sea Level Rise at Old **Dominion University**. The panel included an ODU professor, an environmental education specialist, a researcher in environmental resiliency, and two Frenchspeaking poets from Canada in town for the ODU poetry festival. The discussion varied from the role and passion of individuals, schools, communities, nations, and citizens of the world. Global change is a guiding theme of the AP Environmental Science curriculum. The class also recently took part in tracking the King Tide using their cell phones and an app called Sea Level Rise. King tides occur when the moon, sun, and earth line up to form a tide that reaches higher elevations than normal. Students could plot points where they saw the effects of the tide in their area, aiding scientists in their research of how tides work. The information gathered in this survey also helps to predict more accurate flood forecasts and inform local officials about the risk of flooding.



In the year's first meet in October, a team of students representing Catholic High School won high honors in this year's **WordWright Challenge**, a national language arts competition for high school students requiring close reading and analysis of many different kinds of prose and poetry. Participating with 686 school teams from all across the country, the school's 11th graders tied for 8th place in the nation.

Students achieving outstanding individual results in this meet included: Sophomores Annie O'Flaherty, Nadia Evancho, Josephine Mazzeo, Victoria Noriega, and Xavier Vaquera; Juniors Enyojo Agene, Emma Dale, Amara Davidson, and Richelle Fauni; and Seniors Emily Shook, Nicholas Evancho, and Rhys Nagel.



We are so proud of **Hunter Quigley**, who is one of 1,928 high school seniors selected from a pool of 93,075 submitted applications from across the country as a **Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation Semifinalist!** Semifinalists were chosen based on their academic excellence, leadership and service demonstrated in school and community activities. The Semifinalists are in the running for 150 college scholarships worth \$20,000.



We were thrilled to meet so many future Crusader families and are excited that they are making Catholic High School their choice for Excellence in Education!





It was a special and memorable evening. We are so thankful to all those family members, alumni, faculty, and staff who came out to support these inspiring individuals on their well deserved awards.

2019 Crusader Athletic Hall of Fame Inductees

Lester McKay '77

Motivational Speaker and Performance Coach Les McKay is more than a multiple awardwinning Sales, Sales Training and Business Development Executive in the pharmaceutical industry; his diverse background as an educator, coach and top martial arts instructor has given him a unique perspective on the skills needed for success.

Les was a 1977 graduate and two-sport star at Norfolk Catholic High School. As a senior he was a co-captain of the football team and earned All-Conference and All-State recognition as a tight end and defensive end. In basketball, Les led the Tidewater Conference in rebounding and was a second team All-Conference pick. Les also made the TCIS All-Tournament Team that year.



Les earned a degree from Hampton University in Education while balancing a successful college football career as a member of Hampton University's football team. As a teacher and high profile coach with Norfolk Public Schools, he used his personal experiences to inspire the youth and student athletes he mentored, focusing on accountability, attitude and setting short and long term goals.

He believes that the key formula to success and overcoming obstacles in life is one's commitment to: Family • Faith • Passion • Laughter

Les uses real-world facts, personal testimonies, and humor to captivate and engage his audiences.

Additionally, Les is an accomplished Hapkido martial artist with a 5th degree black belt in both Jin Jung Kwan and Sin Moo Samrangdo. As a Lead Instructor for Executive Martial Arts of Nashville, TN, he trained police officers and the U.S. Army's Special Forces, receiving special recognition from 2nd Battalion, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne) for his contributions to their combat readiness.

Les is currently the Regional Account Manager for a major pharmaceutical company, bringing 17 years of management and executive success to his audience. Thomas B. Kilpatrick

Thomas B. Kilpatrick graduated from St. Paul's Central High School in Portsmouth, VA in 1964. After briefly attending Old Dominion College, he began a 3-year enlistment in the U.S. Army. Following his military stint he attended Christopher Newport College where he played four years of varsity basketball, graduating in 1975 with a BS in General Education. Upon graduating he began a teaching/coaching career with the Portsmouth Public Schools system. During his 20 years with PPS he served as an assistant football coach at Cradock High School and also as an assistant, then later, as the head varsity baseball coach. In his last three years with PPS he was named the head varsity basketball coach at Manor High School (later renamed Wilson High School) and continued there until his retirement in



1995. Also during his time in Portsmouth he served in part-time positions as an assistant basketball coach at Christopher Newport and later as the head coach at his alma mater, Portsmouth Catholic HS, as it was then named.

In the Fall of 1995 he began his second career and his association with Catholic High School of Virginia Beach, being named the director of athletics, serving in that capacity for the next 18 years. For 15 of those years he also coached the varsity boys' basketball team, one year as an assistant coach and the next 14 as the head coach. During his time as athletic director he was selected to serve as an independent schools representative on the Virginia High School League (VHSL) board of athletic administrators. During this period he was named the Athletic Director of the Year for Independent Schools in 2005 by the Virginia Interscholastic Association of Athletic Administrators (VIAAA). He also served on the board of the Virginia Independent Schools Athletic Association (VISAA) and was the President of the Tidewater Conference of Independent Schools, a position he held for six years at the time of his retirement in 2013.

Because of his affection for CHS, Tommy twice returned to the school to assist the athletic department as changes in leadership developed. He is fondly remembered by his co-workers for his organizational skills, attention to detail, common-sense approach to problem-solving, and sense of humor.

Mr. Kilpatrick considers his most memorable achievements while at Catholic High School to be the following:

His role in the expansion and improvement of the athletic facilities at the school.

Developing and implementing various policies and procedures that stress good communication to guide all aspects for the successful operation of the athletic program.

Nurturing positive relationships with the student-athletes, parents, faculty, staff, administration and alumni at the school.

Initiating and maintaining lasting relationships with the other independent and public schools both in and outside of the Tidewater area and, particularly, with our partner schools in the TCIS.

Mr. Kilpatrick currently resides in Portsmouth and spends most of his time playing golf with friends and watching his two beautiful granddaughters grow up.
