



## Home Learning Sheet for Children Self Isolating Things you can do without a screen or lots of resources.

### **More formal work to follow...**

Reading – try to read something different – a magazine, a newspaper or just something you enjoy.

Maths facts - read, say, write times tables facts. KS1 try counting on and back from different numbers.

Create a tricky word trail around your house. Google tricky words for your child's year group or use their spellings and hide them around the house. Can your child find them, say them, spell them, define them?–

Create a Mothers' day card for some-one you love. Maybe make a card for an elderly friend or relative who you are unable to visit at the moment.

Create a treasure map of things in your house. Hide them and try and find them using the map.

Create a clock to learn to tell the time. You could use plates, paper, buckets – whatever you can find.

Keep a nature diary. Look for signs of spring in the garden – flowers, insects – can you draw them? Are they the same the next day?

Can you make a spring garden using items from your house and garden?

What birds can you see in your garden? Can you draw/sketch them. Create a tally or bar chart to show the birds in your garden.

Keep a weather report of each day. Which is the hottest day/coldest day?

Create some role play – create a shop to buy items. Make a garden centre or mud kitchen in your garden.

Make a Lego 3D creation – who can build the tallest/longest? Whose can hold the weight of a book?

Can you spot the 3D shapes in your home – write them down/draw them and sort them. Create a bar chart of the shapes in your home.

Make up a dance routine to your favourite song. Teach your family your dance.

Junk modelling – make a spring insect house or make a musical instrument

Write a book and illustrate it.

Make a sock puppet and use it to create a play or a shadow theatre.

Find out 5 things that happened in the year you were born.
