Dear Parents/Carers

Re: Coronavirus update - school closure to most pupils

Following on from my last update, I am now writing to let you know that we have now been instructed to close the school to almost all children after this Friday until further notice.

As advised by the government, we will do all that we can to stay open for the children of key workers (e.g. NHS staff, police, others in frontline services) and children with certain needs.

We are waiting for the government to publish more information on what this means, but it would help us in the meantime if you could let us know if you think your child may fall into one of these categories. You can do this by:

- Phoning the school
- Emailing the school using office@lhea.org.uk
- Sending your son/daughter in with a signed note on Friday

We will be in touch again as soon as we are sure who falls into these categories.

All other children will need to stay at home, so we ask that you do not send your child into school from Monday onwards.

Please note that this is a national closure – as you may have heard in the news – so while it is a challenging situation, we are not alone. We will re-open fully as soon as we can and will let you know when this is by a message on parent mail and on the school website.

## What we'll continue doing while your child is at home

Your child's learning is of course important to us, so we will continue to help your child to learn. This will be through use of Show My Homework, as has previously been explained. Paper copies of work will be available for collection on Friday and may well be available to collect once the school is officially closed – I will update you on that.

The most effective method of communication with your child's teachers during the closure will be via email. All teaching staff email addresses will be added to the school website.
