Tournament Rules

Tournament Rules: F.I.F.A. rules and guidelines apply.

SCIS Exceptions to FIFA rules:

Substitution

Maximum of **6** substitutes are allowed per match.

Clarification of substitution rulings:

This entails that players must enter and leave the field at the half way line when signalled by the referee. Substituted players may re-enter the game.

Discipline The Tournament Director will keep a precise record of all Yellow & Red card offences. A Red Card (even for a second yellow card) is an automatic one-match ban.

The Tournament Director has the right to extend the punishment or ban a player from further participation altogether depending on the severity of the transgression.

All Round Robin Games

3 pts will be awarded for a win, 1 pt. for a tie 0 pts. for a loss. Should there be a tie within a division **no** extra time will be played. Following any round robin should there be a tie between two or more teams, places will be determined as follows:

Tie-break procedure: FIFA Law

Following any round robin should there be a tie between two or more teams, places will be determined as follows:

In all tie-break situations a maximum of plus or minus 6 goals per game may be counted.

- a) higher number of points obtained in the group matches played among the teams in question;
- b) superior goal difference from the group matches played among the teams in question; (Maximum of plus 6 goals difference per game)
- c) higher number of goals scored in the group matches played among the teams in question;
- d) if, after having applied criteria a) to c), two teams still have an equal ranking, criteria a) to c) are reapplied to determine the final ranking of the two teams. If this procedure does not lead to a decision, criteria e) to g) apply;
- e) superior goal difference from all group matches played;
- f) higher number of goals scored from all group matches played;
- g) penalty shoot-out will be held.

Knock Out and final Games

In all games where a result is necessary no extra time will be played and a penalty shoot-out will take place.

The penalty shoot-out will be done as follows:

- a) Each team will nominate eleven (11) players, including a goalkeeper for each shoot out game.
- b) From the eleven (11) players, the team nominates five (5) penalty takers.
- c) A toss of a coin will decide the option to take the first penalty.
- d) Penalties will be taken alternately. A minimum of five (5) penalties must be taken by each side. If the scores are even at the end of the five (5) penalties, the score must be noted and a sudden death penalty shootout will begin. Only players not used in the original five (5) penalties can be used from the eleven (11) declared at the beginning of the shootout. This continues until one team wins on an equal number of shots.

SCIS REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Curfew, Supervision & Safety

The following rules and guidelines are intended to clarify what the expectations are for both host families and guest athletes with regards to curfew and supervision.

1) **NO** guest athlete is allowed to leave the host family's *local environment* without adult supervision.

Definition: It is acceptable for guest athletes to visit local (walking distance) cafes or take a walk in the local area without adult supervision. It is NOT acceptable for guest athletes to leave the host family's *local environment* without adult supervision. In this case, guest athletes MUST return to the host family no later than 22.00.

2) If host family adults take guests out in the evening then it is important that they return at a reasonable hour (22.00-23.00). Furthermore, guests should be mindful that they are in competition and therefore getting enough sleep throughout the visit is important.

3) **City centers and high profile tourist attractions:**

Clearly SCIS competitions provide wonderful opportunities for visiting athletes to not only compete but also to visit some of the best cultural sites in the world. However, even if this is a host family's local environment we urge host families to use discretion if/when visiting such sites. 4) It is only acceptable for guest athletes to travel with their housing partner(s) along with host students/parents or family members from the tournament venue to the host family before or after the day's competition. From the housing pick up guests must be accompanied by a member of the host family or designated person cleared by the Tournament Director.

SAFEGUARDING:

During the period of the Tournament, host parents will act in 'loco parentis' to their athlete guests, and as such, treat the athlete guests as they would their own children, and have the same expectations with regards to behavior. Athletes must fully respect the host parents and obey all instruction. This applies in all situations irrespective of location, during the period of the tournament.

Smoking, any other use of tobacco, the drinking of alcohol and the use of drugs are not permitted by the guests.

Guests should be extremely careful when using host family's internet access for downloading files (music, movies, etc.) or programs.
