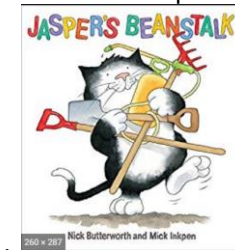


<p>Counting claps. Count to 10, doing the correct number of claps each time. Say a number- can they do the correct number of claps?</p>	<p>Play 'jumping beans'. Everyone moves around. One person shouts out a type of bean and everyone does the action. Jumping Bean - jump up and down Baked bean- curl up on the floor Running bean- run on the spot</p>	<p>Make your own dot-to-dot puzzles. Start simple with easy shapes. Younger children will need some help. With older children you could start to add some numerals.</p>
<p>Play catch. If you don't have a ball, then use a small teddy or even some rolled up socks.</p>	<p>Words of the week: do the words of the week song and talk about what they mean (Badgers should be able to do this with you, but you can use the link below the word of the week)</p>	<p>Choose a story to read together. Cuddle up on the sofa and bring your favourite teddy along to listen! Older children- can they join with parts of the story that they know?</p>
<p>Plant a bean in a bag and watch it grow (dried beans from you cupboard will work). Place wet cotton wool or tissue in the bottom of the bag. Place the bean on top. 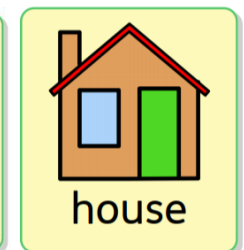
EYFS Activity Ideas – W/C 23.03.20
