- 1. Meeting began at 7:49 am
- 2. Motion to approve February minutes was unanimously approved by all in attendance.
- 3. Goals for the school improvement plan
  - a. Reviewed RISE/SAGE five year data
    - i. Current 5<sup>th</sup> graders, 25 kids need Acadiance intervention, 38 need ELA standards intervention
    - ii. Current 6<sup>th</sup> graders, 18 kids need Acadiance intervention, 32 need ELA standards intervention
    - iii. Language Arts, Math, and Science scores are slightly lower than the district average
  - b. Reviewed SIP goals
    - i. Goal #1 Show 3% increase on Pathways of Progress for students K-6
      - 1. Teacher aides will continue to be funded.
      - 2. Teachers and aides will participate in meetings to identify students who need intervention
      - 3. Training for teachers in software programs
      - 4. Students K-6 will use an online literacy program to support ELA instruction
      - 5. Weekly PLCs for collaborative training including feedback from the administration. Training from innovations ed consultant.
      - 6. After-school Reading Club offered to all students and facilitated by a paid para-professional
    - ii. Goal #2 Show an increased engagement in STEM subjects through personalized learning tools such as NearPod and InfiniD Lab Missions.
      - 1. Purchase licenses for software.
      - 2. Train teachers to use software.
      - 3. Create methods to measure the learning of core science standards to gage if the software is working.
      - 4. Hire a para professional to facilitate InfiniD Lab Missions
      - 5. Hire a para professional to facilitate an after-school math club
    - iii. Goal #3 Continue HOPE Squad to increase the percentage of students who indicate they feel safe on the school climate survey
      - 1. Nominate peers to be in HOPE squad in grades 3-5
      - 2. Hire an advisor to support the HOPE squad

- 3. Training for the school counselor and HOPE squad training
- 4. Monthly meetings to implement HOPE squad goals
- 5. Purchase t-shirts for HOPE squad
- iv. Total expenses for SIP plan are estimated at about \$74,000
- 4. Planning/Marketing Election for Community Council
  - a. Have each community council member write a blurb about their experience on community council and email them to Kristen.
  - b. Have teachers include it in the newsletters they send home with their students.
  - c. Sign ups with email addresses for parents to get more information at kindergarten round up.
  - d. Adam will look into finding a way for online voting.
  - e. Have applicants email a bio and picture to Kristen. Include a link online to voting.
- 5. Plans for school's math emphasis
  - a. iReady is sending out a representative to resolve some issues for implementing the software.
- 6. Note on focus of School Aides for remainder of year
  - a. Aides have been moved to be able to focus their energy on grades K-3 for the rest of the year
