



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


#### PASSING THE TORCH





My first impression of Bill Fitzgerald was an address he gave at an academic awards event in 2013 during the pre-admissions process for my son, William '17. I was immediately struck by his thoughtful, articulate portrayal of the merits of St Joes, with warm words of advice for families in the transition process. Indeed, our decision to commit to the school was in part cemented by Bill's oratorial power, which conjured fond memories of my Jesuit professors. "Yes!" I thought, "That's exactly the kind of person I want educating my son." William has now graduated and my daughter Adele '20 will graduate this May.

I've had the good fortune to work closely alongside Bill – first as a member of the Parent Association, and more recently on the school's Board of Directors. Along the way, I have come to appreciate some essential things about him that may elude the casual observer – including his stealthy, Boston-bred, "wicked" sense of humor. But

importantly, for me as a parent, Bill models a humility that is rooted in service and is refreshingly judgement-free. Reflecting on the mission of the school, Bill once told us, "We are always responsible to God and conscience." I think that perfectly encapsulates what he believes to be the mission of the faculty and staff: to steward – with grateful hearts – each student placed in their care. It is not to press or contort them into a prefabricated academic, spiritual, or social mold, or to pass judgement when they (inevitably) fall short. Bill sees what is beautiful in each young man or woman, not what is missing or deficient.



## AT THE FOREFRONT OF SCIENCE

# The Evolution of the Science Department

The grand rule of nature is "evolve or go extinct", and it is probably equally applicable to education. Over the past five years we have intensified both the depth and breadth of our science program: more students are taking science AP courses and advanced electives than ever before. Increasing scheduling flexibility during junior and senior years now allows pre-college science majors to graduate St Joseph High School with five, or even six years of science preparation, advanced laboratory training, and experience. This has resulted in St Joes graduates obtaining competitive undergraduate science research positions as early as their freshman year in college.

Historically, we have had a high percentage of St Joes graduates enter the medical sciences, and our graduates continue to excel in that field. More recently, science-related engineering and technology courses have diversified and expanded our program to the extent that next year it will spin off a new Innovation and Technology Department. The recent addition of an AP Environmental Science course coupled with boardwalk access to our campus wetlands has expanded our environmental/conservation science strand. While we continue to offer a strong core in the basic sciences of biology, chemistry, and physics, upper class students can now emphasize and explore strands of courses that align more closely with their intended college majors and eventual careers. Our science program has evolved, and will continue to evolve to track the constantly changing educational, college readiness, and future career environments.

Introducing a New Curriculum Strand Focused on

**Technology & Innovation**

If the true purpose of education is to foster the ability to critically think, analyze, explore, and create, than what better way to attain this goal than to offer courses intentionally designed to do just this?

Freshman year, students will begin a new course called IDEA (Innovation, Design, and Engineering Applications) which is a project-based technology rich course. Collaborative, inquiry-based learning will assist the students with the skills needed to be successful in high school and higher education. Many other innovative and technology focused classes can also be taken such as Robotics, Coding, Engineering Design Project, Software Development, and Aviation and Flight Science.

Innovation does not stop with students. Faculty have had professional development on ways to incorporate innovative ideas and projects into the curriculum to engage the learner of today. The English Department has used specially designed video games and interactive blogs to involve the student. It is also common in St Joes to see robots and drones enhancing the curriculum.

## Making the Most of Four Grants Awarded by Foundations in Education

#### Putting the "A" into STEAM Education

In support of our art, theater, and music programs, new technology will propel our course offerings to include Graphic Design I and II, Theater and Set Design, Music Engineering, and

more. The infusion of such technology further prepares students for careers in directing, drafting, media editing, graphic, industrial and product design, multimedia arts and web design.

#### Aviation & Flight Science

This course will enhance student skills in critical thinking, public speaking, task management, and effective communication. Through extensive ground school studies and strenuous

flight training on highly-realistic simulators, graduates of this course will experience a significant portion of the same training civilian and military pilot candidates receive in flight school.



#### Math In Motion

Cadets will use the 8TI Innovator Rover to experience math by adding a physical dimension to verbal, symbolic and graphic representations

of their critical thinking and analytical skills. The 8TI Innovator equipment enables students to become more collaborative and innovative as they explore different ways to move the Rovers while collecting data with CBR2s.

#### ImmerseMe Language Program

The "ImmserseMe" Virtual Reality Language Learning program will connect Cadets to locations across the world to practice conversation

skills with native speakers. These virtual reality experiences will simulate authentic conversations allowing students to develop listening comprehension, fluency, and accuracy in pronunciation of their chosen world language.

## By Her Own Design

## Rosemarie Skawinski Chaves '74 Shares Her Journey From the Halls of St Joes to Drafting Tables at Avco Lycoming

In 1974, the halls of St Joes had a similar rush as they do today. Books in hand, uniform in place, it was just as important then as it is now to be on time and ready to learn. Rosemarie Skawinski Chaves, looks back on those years fondly, and with gratitude for the guidance of Mr Albert Giglio, who at that time was the Head of the Math Department. "Mr Giglio recognized my potential and drew it out of me, which helped me believe I could do anything I wanted to do". At St Joes, Rosemarie earned an award for excellence in mathematics, joined the National Honor Society, and earned a varsity letter in Chess. She credits her parents with giving her a strong, positive foundation that led her to achieve. "I was a product of St Michael the Archangel Parish School in Bridgeport, and always knew I wanted to go to St Joes. When it was time to choose a high school, my parents told me I could go wherever I wanted to go, and they worked

hard to make that happen for me".

Following her intellectual curiosity, Rosemarie gravitated to pursuits that applied her skills with problem solving. Engineering, specifically design thinking, spoke to her. She went on to study industrial design, earning a degree from the University of Bridgeport. In the male-dominated world of engineering, she often found herself the only female in her class. This carried with her well into her career as a Technical Illustrator at Avco Lycoming, Stratford's famed army engine plant. She remembers that time as a "learning experience", where she often found herself the only female in the room or in the department. "No one was my age, and they were often hesitant to include me. But, I held my ground; often reminding them I wasn't going anywhere and that I was the one with college degree when many of them did not have one".

Where many of her male counterparts resisted technological advances, she embraced them. "I took it on, knowing that becoming computer literate with these first technological programs would be beneficial." "My parents gave me the opportunity to go to St Joes, and I know the sacrifices they made to do so. I want to give back the blessings I was given, and share the faith that St Joes gave me to believe in myself".

## Theater Training at St Joseph High School Goes Far Beyond the Classroom Walls

As head of the theatre program, one of my greatest joys is preparing young artists for their college auditions. During my tenure, SJ graduates have gone on to major in theatrical arts at NYU, Emerson University, UCONN, Temple University, Elon University, University of Edinburgh, and more. The college application process is always a rigorous one, but for those interested in pursuing a BA or BFA in theater, the steps are even greater to gain acceptance.

The process starts with the selection of monologues. Often times, schools require a wide array of works; from comedic modern monologues to tragic Shakespearian, and everything in between. Once the student and I pour through the varied application requirements, we select works which we feel will best highlight his/her performance strengths. The selected pieces are rehearsed, recorded, and edited for many weeks to perfection.

We enlist the guidance of successful professional alumni to counsel current students via FaceTime or Google Hangouts. We model the audition process itself and they rehearse each step, from introduction to the transition in and out of their performance pieces, to accepting criticism with grace. By the time St Joes students are auditioning at their chosen universities, they have confidence that they are fully prepared for whatever comes their way.

St Joseph High School graduates go on to have successful college careers and professional experiences. Our group of career professionals, graduates, and rising seniors become a life-long network of mentorship as the process of gaining acceptance to a prestigious program is just the beginning. Our group is in constant support of one another's auditions for Master's Degrees and/or professional careers. I consider myself blessed to be a part of these incredibly talented artists' lives and look forward to celebrating their future successes.

# Providing a Safe Space for Our Students to Ask the "Big Questions"

The faith community at St Joes is second to none. When I arrived just over two years ago, I knew that I was among men and women who cared deeply about the Catholic Church and for each other. I watched students give selflessly to community service projects that helped the materially poor in our local communities and around the world. I experienced true reverence at school-wide masses and, just recently, had the honor to pray with the senior class as we mourned the loss of one of our own students.

Each connection begged the question: what *more* can we do?









Last year we launched two programs: Pizza & Prayer and the Kairos Retreat. Pizza & Prayer brings students of all ages and backgrounds together for a communal meal, student-led testimonials, and Adoration with Music Ministry. Topics of conversation include social pressures, family, relationships, and other challenges that our students carry with them on a daily basis. Pizza & Prayer allows students to ask the *big questions* in a setting that is welcoming and non-judgemental. Consistently we have over forty students in attendance who return because it helps them live out their faith and love for one another authentically.

Our **Kairos Retreat Program** is a three-day retreat examining relationships to self, others, and God through personal testimony, reflection, and conversation. Seniors in the Peer Ministry Program are trained to facilitate small groups, which are mixed by both gender and grade level. Their leadership, coupled with the brave and honest personal reflections of their classmates, provides the platform for spiritual growth and faith formation. Most importantly, Kairos provides a real-life application of faith and friendship that is so crucial in today's world. Student response to the retreat was powerful, with one student writing: "Kairos is verbally indescribable, a truly life-changing and faith-deepening experience. It is something that will remain with me throughout my life."

Here at St Joes we seek to provide a unique and transformative experience for our students that helps form the whole person. I'd say we're onto something great.

## Bringing College Options Directly to Our Students

The College and School Counseling team has prepared and submitted over 1,600 applications to more than 370 colleges and universities. Additionally, 200 college and university representatives have visited campus to recruit our Cadets, host interviews, and deliver acceptance decisions personally. The task of introducing our talented Cadets to a seemingly endless list of college options requires a varied approach to the right fit college search process.

A series of new initiatives over the course of this school year ensures students are aware of the wide variety of college options available. College representatives come in-person or join us via video meetings for the College of the Month program. "Coffee with Counselors" events are forums that focus on student interests. College fairs place students with admission counselors face to face.

This fall, St Joe's College Admissions Night hosted more than 150 parents and students for an open discussion with college admission professionals. Vice Presidents, Associate Vice Presidents, and Directors of Admission offered their candid advice on topics including: visiting the college campus, return on investment, test-optional colleges, value of liberal arts colleges, career development, admission essay tips, and interviews.

College admissions is a dynamic process and St Joes will not leave our students' success to chance. We will continue to innovate to keep St Joes on the short list of college preferred high schools.


cousins, are great illustrations of the virtues and values this family has helped cultivate at St Joes.


