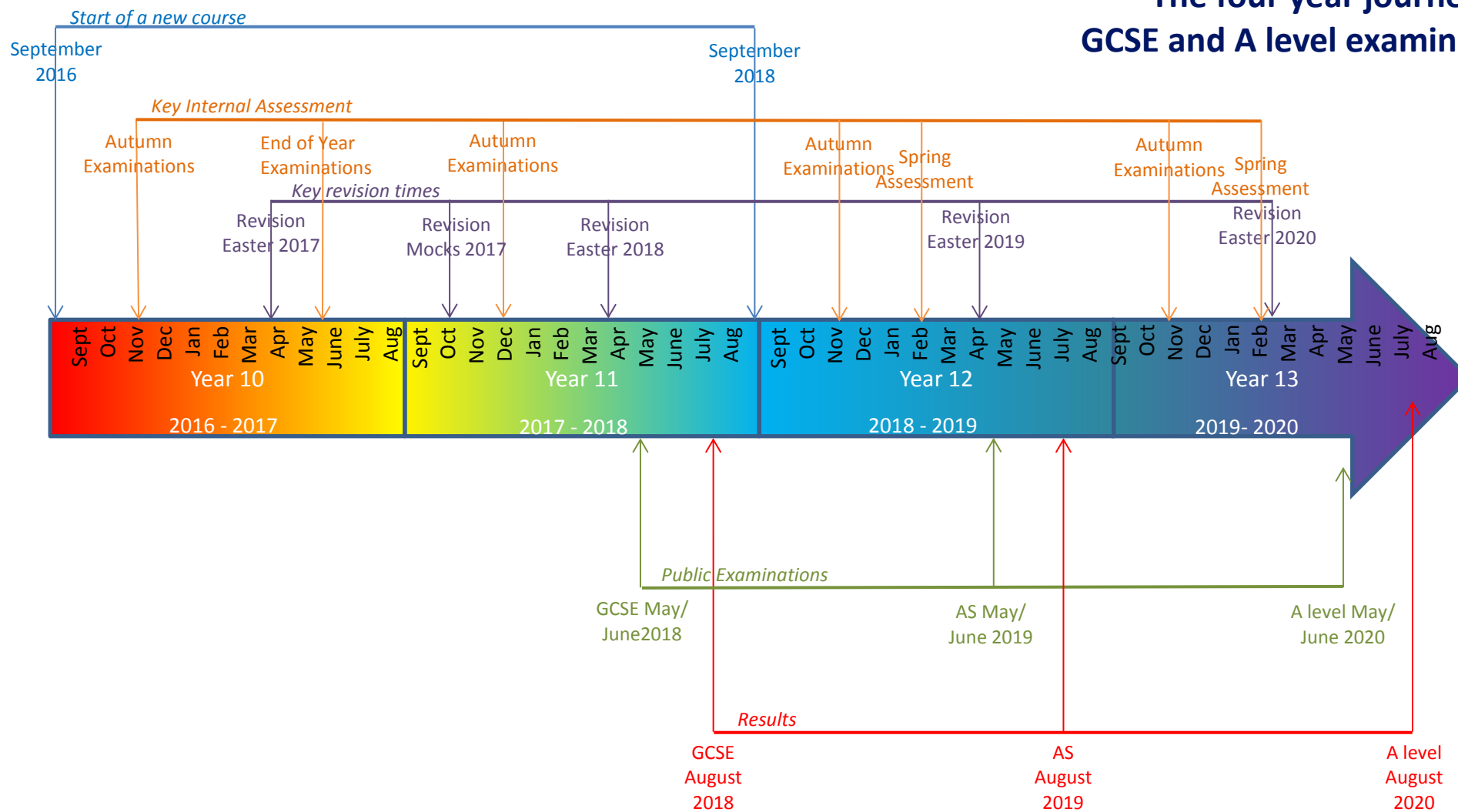

Teaching in schools started for the new AS and A levels from September 2015. The first results for the new AS levels were this summer, 2016 and for A levels will be next summer, 2017. Further subjects will be introduced over the following two years.

The main features of the new qualifications are:

1. Assessment will be mainly by examination, with other types of assessment used only where they are needed to test essential skills.
2. AS and A levels will be assessed at the end of the course. AS assessments will typically take place after one year's study and A levels after two. The courses will no longer be divided into modules.
3. AS and A levels are now decoupled – this means that AS results will no longer count towards an A level.
4. AS levels can be designed by examination boards to be taught alongside the first year of A levels.
5. The content for the new A levels has been reviewed and updated. Universities played a greater role in this for the new qualifications than they did previously.

Each pupil will be issued a personal timetable listing the date, unit and venue for every examination they will be sitting. These will be distributed during the term proceeding the examination season.

Attendance at results day.

General

It is to a student's advantage to be present in school on results day. Clifton High School provides a comprehensive service to our students, on that day, with staff members for every subject available for consultation. In the event that you are considering a "review of marking" or "access to a script" with a view to asking for a remark (review), a discussion with the subject teacher or indeed head of department is essential.

A level

Subject staff and Sixth Form Tutors will be available to assist students with accepting their place at their chosen university or in helping guide them through clearing. Staff will also be able to help should the unforeseen happen and the desired grades are not achieved. At A level it is possible to request "priority reviews" or "priority access to scripts" as university places may hang on achieving another mark or two, but these are time critical and the window to request these is usually only one week. Clifton High School staff will be present on results day to guide the students and their parents on the best course of action.

Key points

Examination types

Public examinations are currently in the process of changing

- Public examinations taken at Clifton High School vary with some modular and some linear

Modular structure

- Made up of at least 2 units
- Units need to be cashed in to gain a qualification
 - Unit 1 + Unit 2 + etc. = UMS points
 - Unit 1 + Unit 2 + etc. + subject cash in code = qualification
- AS = $\frac{1}{2}$ A level
- A2 = $\frac{1}{2}$ A level

Linear structure

- AS = AS qualification Year 12 (1 year course)
 - AS Unit 1 + AS Unit 2 + subject cash in code = qualification
- A2 = A level qualification Year 12 + Year 13 (2 year course)
 - A2 Unit 1 + A2 Unit 2 + etc. + subject cash in code = qualification
(A2 will be made up of between 4 and 6 units)
- GCSE = Year 10 + Year 11 (2 year course)

Examination Language

Modular Examinations

- Cash in code
 - Turns a set of individual unit results into an award, grade or certificate
- Raw mark ✓ x ✓ x ✓ ✓ ✓ x ✓ ✓ 7/10
- UMS mark – calculated from the raw mark with a formula determined by the examination boards
 - A* 90%, A 80%, B 70%, C 60%, D 50%, E 40%, F 30%, G 20%
 - 90/100 UMS marks → A* grade scaled and standardised for GCSE
 - A* at A2 is awarded if
 - The student has enough UMS to gain an A overall and
 - The student achieves 90% or more on the uniform marks subtotal of their A2 units

Non-Examined/Controlled Assessment

- Designed to be done in school time only
- Measures specific skills under different levels of control
 - In lessons
 - Under supervision within school with controlled access to resources
 - Outside the centre and involve research with limited supervision
- Pupils are given advance notice and told in good time
- Guidance provided by teachers
- Usually marked in school and moderated externally
- Where possible, practice is done
- JCQ information leaflet given out to all students

- Draft timetable published
- Personalised timetable issued during preceding term
- Guidance notes from School and JCQ
- Talked through by Examinations Support
- Guidance from subject staff

GCSE Results Day

- Year 11
 - Full results
 - Subject teachers and examinations staff are here to help and explain
 - Guidance will be given regarding Post Results Services

AS and A2 Results Day

- Year 12 (modular AS)
 - It is all about points
 - If stopping studying, then you will gain a qualification at end of Year 13
 - If carrying on, then points are accumulated to gain qualification at end of Year 13 (AS + A2 = A level)
- Year 12 (new linear AS)
 - Choose which subjects you will take as AS. We would highly recommend that pupils sit the AS examinations in all their subjects.
 - AS will be a stand-alone qualification.
 - As the rollover to stand alone AS gets underway, there will be a mix of results – full course and modular units going towards the A2
- Year 13
 - Full results
 - Guidance through the UCAS process
 - Subject teachers and examinations staff are here to help and explain
 - Guidance will be given regarding Post Results Services

What Happens Next?

Post Results Services

- Resits
 - Discuss with teachers and parents to see if this is the best course of action
 - Resits will be the following summer
- If possible get the paper back to help you learn how to improve (access to scripts)
- Review of Marking
 - Ask the board to review the paper if, following discussion with parents and subject teachers, the feeling is that the mark does not reflect actual expectation
 - Marks can go down as well as up
 - A2 students can ask for a priority copy of their script to peruse before making a decision to review marking. The final date for this is usually one week after A level Results Day

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Information for candidates

For written examinations – effective from 1 September 2016

This document has been written to help you. Read it carefully and follow the instructions.

If there is anything you do not understand, especially which calculator you may use, ask your teacher.

A Regulations – Make sure you understand the rules	
1	Be on time for all your exams. If you are late, your work might not be accepted.
2	Do not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice during the exam.
3	If you try to cheat, or break the rules in any way, you could be disqualified from all your subjects.
4	You must not take into the exam room: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • notes; • potential technological/web enabled sources of information such as an iPod, a mobile phone, a MP3/4 player, a smartwatch or a wrist watch which has a data storage device. Any pencil cases taken into the exam room must be see-through. Remember: possession of unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.
5	Do not use correcting pens, fluid or tape, erasable pens, highlighters or gel pens in your answers.
6	Do not talk to or try to communicate with, or disturb other candidates once the exam has started.
7	You must not write inappropriate, obscene or offensive material.
8	If you leave the exam room unaccompanied by an invigilator before the exam has finished, you will not be allowed to return.
9	Do not borrow anything from another candidate during the exam.
B Information – Make sure you attend your exams and bring what you need	
1	Know the dates and times of all your exams.
2	Arrive at least ten minutes before the start of each exam.
3	If you arrive late for an exam, report to the invigilator running the exam.
4	If you arrive more than one hour after the published starting time for the exam, you may not be allowed to take it.
5	Only take into the exam room the pens, pencils, erasers and any other equipment which you need for the exam.
6	You must write clearly and in black ink. Coloured pencils or inks may only be used for diagrams, maps, charts, etc. unless the instructions printed on the front of the question paper state otherwise.
C Calculators, Dictionaries and Computer Spell-checkers	
1	You may use a calculator unless you are told otherwise.
2	If you use a calculator: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • make sure it works properly; check that the batteries are working properly; • clear anything stored in it; • remove any parts such as cases, lids or covers which have printed instructions or formulas; • do not bring into the exam room any operating instructions or prepared programs.
3	Do not use a dictionary or computer spell checker unless you are told otherwise.
D Instructions during the exam	
1	Always listen to the invigilator. Follow their instructions at all times.
2	Tell the invigilator at once if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • you think you have not been given the right question paper or all of the materials listed on the front of the paper; • the question paper is incomplete or badly printed.
3	Read carefully and follow the instructions printed on the question paper and/or on the answer booklet.
4	Fill in all the details required on the front of the question paper and/or the answer booklet before you start the exam. Make sure you fill these details in on any additional answer sheets that you use.
5	Remember to write your answers within the designated sections of the answer booklet.
6	Do your rough work on the proper exam stationery. Cross it through and hand it in with your answers. Make sure you add your candidate details to any additional answer sheets that you use.
E Advice and assistance	
1	If on the day of the exam you feel that your work may be affected by ill health or any other reason, tell the invigilator.
2	Put up your hand during the exam if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • you have a problem and are in doubt about what you should do; • you do not feel well; • you need more paper.
3	You must not ask for, and will not be given, any explanation of the questions.
F At the end of the exam	
1	If you have used more than one answer booklet and/or any supplementary answer sheets, place them in the correct order. Place any loose additional answer sheets inside your answer booklet. Make sure you add your candidate details to any additional answer sheets that you use.
2	Do not leave the exam room until told to do so by the invigilator.
3	Do not take from the exam room any stationery. This includes the question paper, answer booklets used or unused, rough work or any other materials provided for the exam.



Important notes for candidates

What you should do

- Check in which room you will be taking your examination. Most examinations are in the **Gym** but other rooms are used.
- Your examination timetable also tells you which seat you have been allocated. It is your responsibility to know where to go.
- Copies of the examination timetable and seating plans for rooms will be displayed on the noticeboards located in the room where you gather before the examinations.
- Read the examination information sheets and notices outside examination rooms.

On the day of an examination

- You must wear what you would normally wear to School. If you do not wear your uniform/normal school clothes you will have to wear a PE kit provided by the School Nurse.
- You must go to the room allocated for gathering on arrival at School and sign in. Please wait to be escorted to your examination room.
- You are not permitted to bring a bag into the examination room. The same applies to mobile telephones, ipods, smart watches or any other electrical/electronic items.
- **You should arrive by 8:15am* for morning examinations.**
- **You should arrive by 12:45pm* for afternoon examinations.**
- If for any reason you think you are going to be late (e.g. missed the bus, stuck in traffic etc.), do not panic. Telephone the School (0117 973 0201) and come as soon as you can.
- If you are not well enough to attend for an examination, contact the School as soon as possible. You will need to supply a doctor's certificate signed **on or before** the day of the examination.
