DO: ASB Convention, 5-Star Program, Staff Appreciation Week

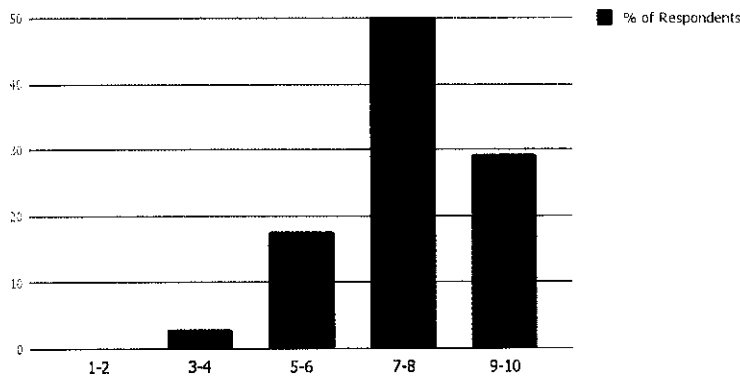
Doing: Oak Ave Exchange (Dec 13), Planning bonding events, Community outreach

Superintendent Perini commended ASB for their positive outreach to all students.


