Updates

Main Committees:

- Executive: elected officials who directly coordinate with the student body
- Activities: plans dances, outings, and games to engage the student body
- Campus: regulate clubs and other on campus activities
- Assemblies: plan assemblies to engage the student body
- Renaissance: give recognition to exemplary students, teachers, and organizations
- Public Relations: contact and inform students through social media

Executive Committee:

- Freshman Class: responsible for the Link Crew, which is a great way to meet upper classmen. This is also an effective way to integrate freshmen and for them to ask any questions and receive advice from upper classmen. There could be more visits from the Link Crew and they are planning to put on more activities.
- Sophomore Class: responsible for planning Winter Formal. The winter formal planning committee was recently chosen and the date of the dance is set to be on January 21, 2017
- Junior Class: two current objectives—1. To renovate the school clock and enable it to chime again; 2. Plan prom. Date has been set for May 20, 2017.
- Senior Class: two main events—1. Graduation budget is \$14,500 out of total beginning budget of \$21,500; 2. Senior class drywall signing on the construction site
- Treasurer: Fix the ASB budget deficits, realign the budget to best serve all of the student body, keep accordance of club budgets
- Secretary: responsible for the Toilet Times (light reading for those in the restroom)

Activities Committee:

- Homecoming will be on November 5th, 2016
- Homecoming game will be on November 4th, 2016
- Theme will be Princess Bride: "As You Wish"
- Will be outdoor on the Senior Circle

Campus Committee:

Clubs: There are 87 total clubs (67 last year)

Interest Clubs are clubs that have access to school for meetings and participate in all club functions, but do not have access to fundraising and field trips off campus.

- Goal of interest clubs: to encourage advisors to chaperone clubs as interest clubs are only restricted to the campus
- Goal of Campus committee: regulate the activities total clubs by ensuring that clubs follow the rules
- Produce efficient clubs that expand the interest of students

Assemblies Committee:

- Goal is to implement a better campus culture by recognizing students all over campus through assemblies and lunchtime activities.
- Had a Mario Go Kart themed assembly

Renaissance Committee

- Highlight student body using Facebook Page: Rams of Renaissance has 382 likes
- Has a VAPA of the Week, Group of the Month, Athlete of the Week
- The Herd is the student section at sports games to encourage the student body to participate and support our athletes.

Committee Updates (continued)

Member Marston: Asked ASB how freshmen get onto ASB—information is sent over to Oak and it begins at Oak. ASB President, Charles Liu, explained that students must run or interview every year, their terms are not renewed. In order to qualify for ASB leadership, students are required to have at least one year on class council. Mr. Marston suggested extending ASB's reach to the elementary schools in order to encourage younger students to get involved. Appreciates everything ASB does, with their creativity and energy.

Closing Comments

Member Pomeroy: Echoed Mr. Marston's sentiments regarding reaching out to elementary school students and leadership opportunities. Appreciates the idea of "interest clubs." Culture clubs are an example of "interest clubs." Was very impressed by ASB's presentation and felt that it was very polished.

Member Goold: Both his daughters went to Temple City schools and were on ASB. His grandchildren are currently Emperor, Oak, and the high school. Enjoys being involved with all the school spirit activities; thanked ASB for their leadership.

Member Knollenberg: Thanked ASB for their presentation and echoed Member Pomeroy's comments. Believes ASB is a great communication tool between the student body and the Board. Being on ASB is a great experience, will help on your application to college, and help out in their future jobs. Mentioned the Temple City Schools Foundation and their grants they award to various school groups. Mentioned the Sister City Australian Exchange students and how much they enjoyed their time at the high school, which is a direct reflection of how great ASB is.

Member Bell: Thanked the students for their energy; ASB is the spark plug that makes everything work; the "Herd" is awesome; encouraged students to recruit more students to be involved in ASB; congratulated seniors graduating this year especially as they move on to college; encouraged students to study hard but also to take the time to "smell the roses"; students are our Country's future leaders.
