Founded in 1923, John Burroughs School is an independent, coeducational, college preparatory day school for grades 7-12 located on a 49-acre campus in St. Louis, Missouri. Burroughs strives to instill the joy of living through active learning, integrity, and service to others. We seek to cultivate an inclusive community that nurtures authentic learners who lead and inspire meaningful lives. Burroughs currently has 640 students, 42% of whom identify as students of color. (This year's 7th grade class is 50% students of color.) Twenty-four percent of the student body receives tuition aid.
