Optional Activity: Bean bag Toss/Sock Toss

Use a bean bag, or a pair of socks rolled into each other to make an object to throw.

Set up a bucket/basket/storage bin.

Set up spots (paper or any item to stand behind or on) 3 separate distances away from target (Bucket/basket, etc)

Assign points to each marker.

Student will run around whatever "course" you have available to come to a "marker" and toss the bean bag/socks toward the bucket. If they make it, they get the points assigned to that spot. If they miss, no points, and they go again. Set a number of rounds to play or a total to achieve first.

Alternative Assignment

Materials needed:

- 2 tablespoons of cooking oil (such as vegetable, corn or canola)
- 1 cup of water
- 1 clear plastic container with lid (or plastic soda bottle with cap)
- 1 bottle of food coloring
- 1 tablespoon of liquid dish washing soap

Experiment 1: Adding Food Coloring to Oil and Water Mixture

For this experiment, you will observe that food coloring does not mix with oil but mixes with water.

Add a few drops of food coloring to the oil and water mixture.

Cover the container with the lid and shake the container.

Place the container down and remove the lid.

Observe what happens over the next few minutes and write down observations.

You will observe the oil separating from the water and rising to the surface. You will also observe that the food coloring mixes with the water, but not with the oil.

Experiment 2 : Combining Oil and Water

For this experiment, you will learn the process of emulsion. This is done by adding soap to an oil and water mixture.

Add a tablespoon of dish soap to the oil and water.

Place the lid on the container and shake the container.

Place the container down and remove the lid.

Record observations.

What has just occurred is called emulsification. In an emulsion, one liquid contains a dispersion of the other liquid. Common examples of this include, egg yolk, butter, and mayonnaise.

DANDELION FLOWER

Supplies needed:

-Toilet paper rolls

-paper

-paints in desired colors

-a plate to put the paint on

-paint brush

(If the only paint you have is watercolor paint, you can still do this project! Paint a few strips at a time and place quickly on the paper. The watercolor paint will dry quicker, but will still work and turn out great!)

1. Cut the bottom of your toilet paper roll into strips
2. Dip that bottom part into your paint or you may need to put the paint onto the roll
3. Place the painted part of the t.p. roll onto the paper and stamp! You will notice the design of a dandelion quickly taking shape
4. Make as many as you want or use as many colors as you want
