Dear Third Grade Families,

Hello! You will find activities to help your child stay engaged in reading, writing, math, and social studies in order to practice and maintain taught skills. There is a labeled file for each activity.

Goal for these activities:


- Practicing reading comprehension strategies and reading fluency as well as maintaining writing skills.
- Quick recall of multiplication and division facts up to $10 \times 10 = 100$ and up to $100 \div 10 = 10$
- Social Studies - learn about historical events.

You will find these activities for your child:

- A reading strategy, envisioning, that your child can practice with any fiction text! The folder includes a reminder of the skill, a fun way to practice the skill in the book they are reading, and activities to extend their practice.
- Fluency practice – use the story to practice your reading fluency or choose a paragraph or short page from your reading and practice reading smoothly and with expression. Practice, practice, practice and with family permission record a short video of your reading fluency – email your video to your teacher!

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- Writing – we included a menu of writing prompts to encourage your third-grade author!
- Math - By the end of the year, all third graders should know their multiplication facts up to $10 \times 10 = 100$ and know their division facts up to $100 \div 10 = 10$. Knowing these facts will help support them in future grades with multi-digit multiplication and division problems. The materials we've provided this week will help students start practicing their multiplication facts in fun ways!
