

Hello 4<sup>th</sup> Grade families and students,

We hope that everyone is well and ready to get back into the learning! This week's activities include reading, writing, math, social studies, and social emotional learning. These are optional assignments and we would love to hear from you once you have completed these activities.

**Social Studies** - For social studies this week, you will click on the "social studies week one" PDF. Don't click on the Coastal Salish Native American article unless you need to. You will watch the YouTube video and then respond in a summary on a section of your choice. There are more directions in the PDF. If you need to reach out to any of us don't hesitate to do so.

**Reading** - Each day of the week you should read for at least 60 minutes and journal about your thinking. Remember to think about your reading as you read. Don't just read and forget. The fiction goals a 4th grader should be working on are; Writing a summary, analyzing parts of a narrative, analyzing character traits, analyzing how characters change, and analyzing themes. Working on these goals will prepare you for 5th grade and beyond.

**Writing** - This week you will go through the writing process to plan, draft, edit, revise and publish a Narrative essay. Each day will be a different part of the process. Think about the connection between your Reading of narratives and writing narratives. Continuing to work on these goals will keep your writing sharp and prepare you for 5th grade and beyond.

**Math** - For math this week, students will review their understanding of prime and composite numbers, factors and multiples, and equation writing. They will also review rounding large numbers, finding the sum, and repeated addition. The worksheets are available in English and Spanish languages. An answer key has been provided. Students also have a Hands-On mathematics activity. The directions are included with the activity.
