New On-Campus Learning Resumption Date - Tentatively May 4, 2020

Due to ongoing concerns around the COVID-19 pandemic, and after consulting with our administrative team and the Board of Directors, ISK has shifted its date for resuming on-campus learning. May 4 is the new, **tentative** date to resume on-campus learning. While learning will continue online, the ISK Campus will therefore remain closed from now until at least May 4th. The school will be reevaluating this date as the situation progresses.
