Dear Beecher Road School Families,

This letter marks the launch of the Beecher Road School Distance Learning Plan. The purpose of this plan is to provide teaching and learning for our students during the current extended school closure. Goals for our distance learning plan include:

- · To keep students academically motivated
- To review previously taught materials
- To introduce new content and concepts

This plan provides students with an alternate means to teaching and learning, however, we acknowledge that distance learning is not a substitute for the richness of in-class teaching that provides the opportunity for students and teachers to collaborate, confer, engage and learn together. For our students who require an IEP, case managers are working to address the varied needs of students through individualized remote learning plans.

We recognize that every family is different, as is every student. We also know that children benefit from a familiar daily structure, especially in times of uncertainty. To that end, we are providing a possible daily schedule. The times suggested on the following pages can be adapted for your needs; and times may vary! If this schedule does not work for you, we encourage you to create one with your child. We also suggest that you create a dedicated space for your child to complete their work. Finally, the sample schedule does include optional enrichment and extension activities. While some of this work might be provided by teachers, consider other options such as lego building, puzzles, baking together, doing random acts of kindness and going on a nature walk.

It is expected that all students will participate in, and complete, assigned work during this time of distance learning to the best of their ability. If your child requires assistance or has questions about a particular assignment, please contact your child's teacher. If your child will be "absent", please report it in the usual means; by calling the attendance hotline at 203-389-2195. This will allow us to continue to track absences and illnesses. Although not all work will be graded, teachers will be reviewing it on an ongoing basis. This will, of course, look different for every grade level. Teachers will be sharing out the distance learning plans with their classes through email and Google Classroom. Teachers will be available via email to respond to questions you or your child may have. All of us are experiencing both personal and professional challenges at this time, and we thank you in advance for your continued collaboration and patience.

In summary:

- The provided schedule is merely suggested. Please make a plan that works for you and your child!
- If your child is absent, please call the office as you usually would.
- Teachers will be sharing their first distance learning plans via email and Google Classroom prior to this Monday March 30.
