Dear BCS Students and Parents,

Grace and peace in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! As we all are adjusting to our "new normal" for however long or short the Lord may have it, I write to share multiple matters of interest with you. Before I begin please let me say how sorry I am for the disruption the coronavirus has caused to your Briarwood experience over the last few weeks and into the near future. Our hearts go out to all of you who have had performances, athletic seasons, trips, projects and special events either cancelled or suspended. We feel that pain and burden *with* you. Yet here we are, by God's grace, ready to embark on a new journey in our educational process. Thankfully, in the Lord's providence, we have had two weeks to plan and prepare for this coming Monday. We look forward to rolling out our Remote Learning Plan. I highly stress the importance of <u>ALL parents and ALL students</u> sitting down and reading through this letter together. LEARNING PLANS

Our teachers have worked diligently under the watchful eye of our Dean of Academics, Dr. Heather Mays, to create engaging, purposeful weekly plans that will be sent to students Monday morning between 7-8am. Instead of sending daily work, the focus of our planning has been to create and provide meaningful units of study where most are designed to be completed by Thursday at 3pm. During this first week, we understand there will be some adjustments to this new learning style. I have heard of schools where students have felt absolutely overwhelmed at the daily amount of work given and this most certainly is not what we want for our students here at Briarwood. We desire this learning experience to be meaningful, enjoyable and challenging, but manageable. During the planning process, each of our teachers submitted their plans to both their departments and their grade levels for evaluation to ensure that the type of work and the amount of work being required were both reasonable and manageable for our students. Running each weekly plan through this grid, we believe we are ready to offer students a robust and reasonable academic program via remote learning. Friday will be used for teacher grading and assessment feedback to students.

WEEKLY RHYTHM OF INSTRUCTION

We will NOT be assigning work over the weekend. New assignments will be posted Monday morning between 7-8am. The rationale for this is two fold:

- 1. Teachers need time to adjust lesson plans based on work submitted from students and their own evaluation of how each week progresses.
- 2. It is my sincere hope that our students' "sabbath" from their remote learning. If we give students new work on Friday, the days and weeks will run together as some will start work immediately. Our kids and families need to step away on weekends. Get outside and enjoy the spring weather!

TEACHER OFFICE HOURS

Central to the mission and work of Briarwood are the relationships between faculty and students. We are committed to maintaining those relationships despite our required "social distancing". Our aim in remote learning is to create a learning environment in which instruction and conversations would be undertaken in much the same manner as if things were continuing in a normal fashion. All upper school teachers will be accessible to students Monday - Thursday 9am-12pm. Each teacher will notify students of the best way to communicate with them during this time.

TUTORING SERVICES

Several of the tutors approved through our screening process and used regularly by BCS families have offered to provide tutoring services via video conferencing apps such as Zoom, Skype, and Facetime. DAILY FAMILY DEVOTIONAL GUIDE

Our Dean of Discipleship, Mr. Bryan White, has created a wonderful weekly devotional guide for your family to use during this time together. (See Remote Learning webpage) We *highly* encourage families to set time aside to first have family meals together, and then to spend time in God's word together using the devotional guide and the provided discussion questions. Talk about what God's Word has to say to you in this moment in time we are experiencing both here at Briarwood and around the world. The Brower family will be using this guide for sure!

BRIARWOOD FAMILY CONNECTIONS

It is our plan to send videos to you that would provide a semblance of some of our communal gathering events that are meant to encourage, inspire, and give you a sense of our continued connectedness and belonging. We would very much encourage EACH student to begin their Monday morning opening up the Monday morning devotion before jumping into your academic work. In addition, we would encourage all students to take a break on Thursday and to open up the brief chapel talk around 10:30am. We love the idea that around 10:30am, all students are hearing the same message simultaneously.

- Monday video daily *devotions*
- Thursday video *chapel* message
- Friday "*Friday Flashback*" we will send you a great BCS video of something that has occurred in the past to (3Rs) reflect, remember, and rejoice in the great experiences the Lord has allowed us to enjoy together.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT PLANS

In an effort to stay connected and continue to support our students with an active 504 plan through our Academic Support Program, we will host scheduled Zoom video calls for ASP students Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Parents, it will be important for your child to have a device accessible to them so they may participate in these scheduled Zoom calls. (See the schedule below.) Students will need to click on the link that will be sent to them in an email from the ASP instructor and select "join a meeting" to join the call at their assigned time. HS SERVICE HOURS

Considering that we are in the middle of a pandemic, you may be wondering how you are going to earn the rest of your service hours or if we are even still requiring students to complete their service hours. The truth is the world around us needs us now more than ever and, as I mentioned in



my first video chapel, this pandemic has provided us with an opportunity to "extend [our] arms" and serve others. Therefore, we are still requiring students to complete their required hours as part of their grade for their Bible course (10 hours for freshman and sophomores; 20 hours for juniors and seniors). While there may be opportunities for you to serve your neighbors—mowing a neighbor's lawn, making a run to the grocery store for an elderly neighbor—we want to encourage you to practice social distancing and to only engage in opportunities that your parents are comfortable with. Understanding that this may greatly limit your opportunities, we want to expand your options by allowing you to serve those closest to you—your family. There are plenty of great ways to do this that will make things easier on your family as your parents attempt to navigate uncharted waters. Service must still be voluntary and you can't receive payment for your services, but there are many great ways to serve around the house including: mowing the lawn, "babysitting" younger siblings, cooking a meal, making a grocery run, cleaning the house, doing the laundry, and more! As you log hours, simply list your parents as the supervisor—be sure to include their email address—and have them verify your hours. As some of you still have yet to create an X2VOL account or join your groups and goals for the year, we have included brief instructions on how you can do that (see Remote Learning webpage). We look forward to seeing all the great ways you serve in the midst of the storm!

AP COURSE CONTENT AND ABBREVIATED AT HOME EXAMS

By now, our AP teachers and students have received official word via email from College Board that AP course content and exams have been altered to accommodate the unique learning environments of the COVID-19 pandemic. On Friday, March 21st, our AP teachers reviewed the content that will be on each exam and made adjustments to the remaining units of the semester and their exam review plans. They will be rolling out their new plans with students on March 30th, including student access to daily live reviews through the AP website and information about free-response questions for review. The College Board will be providing additional information about the at-home exams on April 3rd; we plan to update students and families as soon as we have more information.
