Writing: A "tool" that gives a poem rhythm and music is Onomatopoeia. Onomatopoeia is a figure of speech in which words are used to imitate sounds. It creates a sound effect that mimics the thing described, making the description more expressive and interesting.

For example: buzz, hiss, zing, clippety-clop, pop, splat, thump, sizzle
