Terra Linda is by far the most socio economically disadvantaged school north of 26. Once construction is complete in the next few months on the new low income housing that is being built in our boundary it is likely we will have netted the 8 reduced lunch students needed for us to become a title one school. Not 8 percent, 8 individual kids to be a title one school. By the time the new boundaries take effect Terra Linda will either be title one or will fall short of that distinction by literally 1-2 kids. We are the only school feeding into Timberland that provides any sort of socioeconomic diversity and we have a higher percentage of Hispanic students than any other feeder. We would not be effective in lowering the free and reduced lunch if placed into Meadow Park or Cedar Park. Please request free and reduced lunch numbers for all schools. See how we are 35 to 38 percent depending on the source. Look at and how Oak Hills is 16 percent, Findley is 6 percent, Bonnie slope is 10 percent only because they have apartments that are not continuous and down south of Timberland, Cedar Mill is 13 percent. How is removing the 50 kids a year from Terra Linda that are by the time the school opens likely over 40 percent free and reduced lunch and putting them into Meadow Park going to accomplish anything but accidental discrimination. Timberland is our neighborhood school. We are the poor and the Hispanic kids of that neighborhood. Bussing us across 26 accomplishes nothing good and is a disservice to the students at Timberland as well as the Terra Linda kids.

Now, if there was a disparity of 50%#, I would agree that switches need to be made. But, I believe a 20-30% difference is in a range of tolerance that you all should consider satisfactory. That said, should/can the district give advice on what it deems to be an acceptable range of tolerance between schools - so we can all put this puppy to bed? It will cost an additional 50K per year to add bus routes to support this change. Many W Chehalem students are within walking distance to Mountain View but will have to be bused far if their boundaries change2. The committee spoke of equity using free and reduced lunch as a talking point. However, this is a very narrow lens of equity. Studies show that walking to school actually improves test scores as well as has a myriad of other health and environmental benefits. <a href="https://www.saferoutespartnership.org/safe-routes-school/101/benefits">https://www.saferoutespartnership.org/safe-routes-school/101/benefits</a> . W Chehalem students lose out on these benefits when they are having to sit on a bus for 20-30 minutes rather than being able to walk to school. 3. Cooper Mountain students are supposed to go to Mountainside; why send them to a middle school that primarily feeds into a different high school?4. Fostering communities. I know that there is a large push to have all elementary schools have a single feeder pattern but this is an ideal that doesn't work when you look at the maps. The Cooper Mountain community that currently feeds into Highland neighbors Sexton Mountain and Nancy Ryles families whose boundaries send them to Highland and ultimately Mountainside. Our school board zone representative is the same. By separating us, we would have a different school board representative for a few years or have two different ones simultaenously for those of us with kids of different school ages. This does not align in the interests of fostering community.This change then becomes counter productive to the committee's objectives. Equity is about reducing barriers and offering the same opportunities to all students across the district and the state. This is the goal of the Common Middle School Experience and must be addressed. It was brought up in comments that reducing poverty at Mountain View would create equity, with scholarly references provided. However, if you read the scholarly articles, they do not talk about lowering FRL within a school as a way to create equity or even as a way to measure equity. The Handbook on Measuring Equity in Education, at collaborative effort through University of Cambridge discusses myriad ways to measure equity. All address what is offered within the schools, and what the district does to prevent barriers to attendance, reduce staff turnover and offering supports to those who need help for food/housing insecurity, mental health and transportation. This is not being discussed. In fact, this move adds 2 bus routes, reduces walkability for low income students (thereby increasing barriers to attendance), costing \$50K which could be used for staff training and support, and barely moves the needle on FRL as a way to check a box and feel that something was done for equity. This plan is not helpful, but is potentially harmful to hundreds of students. Please reconsider the move of Chehalem ES to HPMS and Cooper Mountain ES to MVMS and please address inequality with our schools with Common Middle School programs that will help not boundary changes that do not have anything to do with the original objectives of this committee to address overcrowding at Stoller and filling of Timberland.Thank you</p>
