Most of the members agreed on SPV, Sato, JW & a part of Findley (Oakridge estates) to be assigned to Stoller. Let's divide this into following categories. Primary : SPV, Sato and WV feeding JW. Secondary 1: Sunset feeding JW - based on the availability of space at Stoller/Timberland. From a feeder patterns, Timberland seems to be the best option but if no space there, obviously Stoller is the only option left for us. Secondary 2: Summa, Oakridge estates (3 grid codes) - Suggest not to include them at Stoller. Recommend to know the interest of Oakridge estate community before adding the 3 grid codes to JW/Stoller. Not sure if they prefer to go to brand new Timberland as they were part of Findley for many years. While Summa is in the hands of T&L, a recommendation from this committee that - Summa to be moved to Timberland is very much appreciated. This is an optional program. Let's first address regular education for NW Bethany kids before jumping on Summa and other programs. Let's utilize the capacity of Timberland as much as possible with 95 to 98% occupancy ratio. RC and Bethany elementary to Five Oaks is a good idea and certainly helps with respect to MS to HS feeders as entire Five Oaks reports into WV HS. There's a clear misunderstanding as to where Barnes ES kids will be attending High School due to their Dual Language Program. If they enter the DL program, their families make a contractual agreement to attend through 12th grade which would lead them to Beaverton High School. Anyone that opts out of this program at Barnes ES is then assigned to William Walker which feeds to Cedar Park and then BHS. With this in mind, Barnes cannot be considered a clear feeder to SHS. This is why Oak Hills East should attend middle school with Terra Linda and West Oak Hills should attend middle school with Bethany to stay in line with Objective 4 which is to establish clear feeders. 2. Barnes Dual Language students are not part of the Sunset feeding community. Barnes will soon be 100% Dual Language and their kids are in separate classes in middle school. It's not that we're snooty, it's that we just don't know them. Their kids are kept completely separate. BSD has created this program and this division, it has nothing to do with the Oak Hills kids not socializing with them. Just like they have done with Summa, the district needs to quantify the number of dual language students and remove their numbers from the Sunset-feeding numbers. 4. As Oak Hills East identifies with the Cedar Mill community, it would be best to attend Timberland for middle school. As Oak Hills West identifies with the Westview community, they should remain at Westview and attend middle school with Bethany. 4. By establishing clean feeders it also supports walkability to our respective high schools. All of Oak Hills East is included in the 2 mile walkability radius of Sunset. Part of Oak Hills West lies within the 2 mile walkability radius of Westview. If Westview truly needs to unload students, please move students from schools that are already being bussed in order to save the precious transportation dollars of BSD. For example, to increase the number of Sunset-feeding kids at Stoller, all of Jacob Wismer should attend Sunset. 5. We have had several Town Hall meetings (some attended by school board members) in our homes, the school, and the community center of Oak Hills. We are united in our message to split before middle school. One dissenting voice with no affected child at a school board meeting does not represent our unified recommendation. 6. Oak Hills does not want to become the "fix-it" school to help FRL numbers at any one school. BSD has the responsibility to end the isolation of Oak Hills East kids and create a clear feeder to Sunset in this process. 7. Oak Hills East is a neglected pocket of the district. We don't have a loud voice like other schools in the North, and we're not enough kids to be really concerned about ..... according to statements that have been made by district personnel. Yet the committee members said they were voting solely on the basis of equity even though the data does not support that reason. The district initiated the Student Success Act with a plan in August of 2019 to make education more equitable using a variety of criteria listed in the draft of the plan. Much of that is about allocating resources to schools so that they can better serve underprivileged populations. The plan does not mention uprooting students deemed to be more privileged, based solely on perceived socio-economics, by placing them in another school. More importantly, the plan does not say disenfranchise students who would stand to benefit from resources allocated to a specific school and then bus them to a different school. To that end, the March 12 data also stated that making these changes would add 50K to the transportation budget to implement two new bus routes even though West Chehalem families are currently within walkable distance to Mountain View. Surely we would rather allocate that money to fund the Student Investment Account (SIA) that would support the Student Success Act, rather than spend the sum on transportation. Considering all this data, please keep the status quo for Cooper Mountain and Chehalem.

I know it has been a long and challenging process and appreciate the committee's due diligence to review data, discuss options, consider the community impact, and focus on the objectives up until this last meeting. The 3/12 meeting was long and tiring, and I understand that the committee's deadline is approaching and decisions need to be made. However, it felt that the committee was rushing through decisions without applying the same due diligence that was given up to that point. When establishing boundary proposals for schools on the south end of the district, not every factor was considered, the priority was clearly solely to balance free and reduced lunch numbers with disregard to the thousands of families being disrupted, increased cost, impact to feeder patterns, and reduced walkability. These communities don't deserve this significant level of disruption simply because there is no time to discuss all important factors. Please consider leaving the south side school boundaries as they currently are as they meet the JC factors, only making minor adjustments as needed to balance capacity based on the new north side boundaries. Please keep Cooper Mountain feeding to Highland Park.

For months it has been rather obvious that the any combination of SPV and Sato together in Stoller would clearly exceed the 90% target set forth by the BSD Board. Yet, LRP persisted in keeping alive this objective and insisted on reinserting the maps that had all of Findley (including the 53% of Findley that is walkable to Stoller) heading to Timberland while they ever-burgeoning SPV and Sato remained in Stoller. Try as they may, LRP could not square that circle. But then at the 11th hour, if they couldn't find a solution to support their desired alignment (SPV, Sato, JW in Stoller; and Findley heading to Timberland) through the front door, why not try the back? Instead, they re-engineered the data so the numbers worked out to support the map that they had continued to reintroduce all along. If we are to believe that the leaders of LRP have done their homework and are to be trusted with the future attendance decision of our middle school students, why did it take so long to discover this mistake? Why now? LRP consistently highlights the need to assume the best intentions of all participating in this process. This is rather difficult given the reality of this most recent turn of events. The timing of this emergent data reevaluation certainly calls into question not only the integrity of the officials guiding this project, but also their competence. If what is purported is actually true, that there actually was a modeling oversight which erroneously overstated SPV's long term growth, how then are we to trust the leaders of LRP that ALL the data they purport to be accurate is not equally erroneous? Alas, should we not summarily reject outright ALL the data they purport to be valid? That is not an illogical conclusion. In the end, I find LRP's attempt to specifically draw a zero-sum game between the three walkable zones of Findley ES (again, an area representing 53% of all Findley ES attendance area) and the eviction of SUMMA from Stoller to be empty, groundless, and irresponsible. They cite their calculations and specifically purport that by permitting children who are now walkable from Findley to continue to attend Stoller would leave no room for SUMMA at Stoller. But as noted above, these are the same individuals who were either so incompetent that they didn't realize their SPV numbers were off by 25% for months, or so nefarious that they felt the need to cook the books at the 11th hour. Again, why should we trust these individuals now or the data they present? Where is the concern for the extra outlays necessary to bus children who can walk to school or the unnecessary carbon footprint this will produce? My trust in the leadership and guidance of the LRP, and by extension the BSD Board who is supervising this process, is broken. As I have said before in prior posts and emails to LRP, please, finally, show the district your mettle. Do the right thing most certainly in the face of this most recent slight of hand. Stop playing games. Let walkable Findley children remain walkable and that is to include SUMMA walkable children at Stoller.
