LEADERSHIP, ENTREPRENEURSHIP, & CORPORATE RESPONSIBILITY

For the past 10 years, 8th grade students have graduated with a viable, individual business venture. Many of those businesses are often focused on non-profit work and causes of social impact in the greater community. To-date, 309 personal businesses from our graduates are making a positive impact on surrounding communities, including:

- Team Up Athletes: a non-profit started by now alum, Tucker Shearn to raise awareness on depression in teenagers and generate action towards suicide prevention.
- Tuber: an app developed by alum, Parker Durand that provided affordable on demand tutoring services and generated funds for donation to JDRF in support of research for Type 1 Diabetes in youth.
- Harp from the Heart: a non-profit therapeutic music company founded by student harpist, Kaila Davidson, that provides musical therapy to those in need.
- Rudspice: a spice business founded by Emily Rudnick, winner of the 2018 YouthBiz Stars Competition from Young Americans Bank.
