At Slough and Eton, the number of students in 2018-2019 who have not achieved the expected standards in KS2 National Curriculum assessments is 50 and the Catch-Up funding helps to fund a number of interventions and projects. These include a transition group, reading interventions and extra support in lessons. The funding has also contributed towards addressing the issue of language acquisition and consolidation, continuing and expanding its programme of one-to-one and small group tuition. In addition, all students have the opportunity to have a free breakfast in the mornings.

The students benefit from a heavily subsidised programme of enrichment opportunities ranging from educational visits to historical places of interest to theatre trips related to their studies. These visits help to broaden the students' horizons and expose them to activities they would not normally experience. The impact of these is very difficult to measure but we feel it gives the students valuable context for their studies.

- 18 students improved their reading age by over a year during the course of Year 7 (51%)
- 3 students improved their reading age by over 2 years during the course of Year 7 (9%)

English

- This includes 14% who are now exceeding their expected level

Reading

- On average the cohort improved by 0.5 years reading over the year
- 9 students improved their reading age by over a year during the course of Year 7
- 2 students improved their reading age by over 2 years during the course of Year 7 (9%)

English

- Students that were below 100 in GPVS 54% are now on or above the expected level for Year 7
- This includes 23% who are now exceeding their expected level
- Average increase of 1.6 sub grades

Maths

- Students that were below 100 in Maths- 75% are now on or above the expected level for Year 7
- This includes 19% who are now exceeding their expected level
- Average increase of 2 sub grades
