5	Review of District Data See Think Wonder	Facilitator	25 min	For Information: <u>Think See Wonder</u> About the class of 2019 § Goal- Increasing the number of students who graduate with an advanced designation diploma. § Started the data with looking at AP results ○ <u>ELA results</u> - majority of classes saw an increase in passing and mastery AP and CC exams. There has been more of a diverse offering of literature. In the higher levels, more rigorous research. § 9-12 students have worked with a professor at Brockport to best support students to get to that level ○ <u>Math results</u> - at the secondary level they have been working with the U of R, they are working on selecting more rigorous inquiry-based tasks. § Assessments in math - they are looking at the types of questions being asked, knowledge transfer questions, using a combination of assessments.

Learning opportunities are similar no matter the instructor. ○ <u>Fine arts results</u>- the IB visuals art exam has a low pass rate. Which do we do? IB or AP? ○ <u>World Language</u>- All regionally created exams.
