

- Add the numbers from the same grey triangle section together and place the sum (answer for addition) in the lower white triangle section in the box.

Social Studies

This week we are going to go back in time over 400 years to examine the East Coast of what is now, America. Under the 'other' section of the Grade 5 In-home learning, you will find a PDF called Colonies Poster. This document provides instructions for learning about three different regions on the East Coast. After you've had an opportunity to read about the colonies, you'll be asked to choose one region and produce a poster about it. Feel free to be creative! If you want to produce something different than a poster, like a website or essay, go ahead! Included with the Poster document are several articles about the Colonial time period that you can read for background information.

Reading

Each day reread the 2 articles on water bottles. You will read them 5 times this week. Each day you read the article you will focus on a different nonfiction thinking skill. Use either article to answer your daily question. Remember to think about your reading as you read. Don't just read and forget. The nonfiction goals a 5th grader is working on are; writing a summary, analyzing relationships in a nonfiction text, analyzing the author's craft, analyzing the author's perspective and comparing 2 nonfiction texts on the same topic. Working on these goals will prepare you for 6th grade and beyond.

Writing

This week you will go through the writing process to plan, draft, edit, revise and publish an Informational essay. Choose a topic that interests you. Each day will be a different part of the process. Think about the connection between your Reading of narratives and writing narratives. Continuing to work on these goals will keep your writing sharp and prepare you for 6th grade and beyond.
