Dear District 95 Students,

Happy Friday! As we complete another week of eLearning I am happy to report that overall our eLearning plans are working well across all levels. I hope you are as pleased as I am that your attendance levels continue to show a high rate of participation in our eLearning programming, for example our secondary attendance yesterday was 99%. Way to go!

Also, as you know, this week we introduced Zoom as a new tool to extend our virtual learning capabilities and allow for connections between you and staff. Over the course of this week, as staff were getting used to incorporating this new tool into their lessons, 486 Zoom sessions were held from Monday through Thursday. These numbers will only increase as next week teachers will begin using Zoom (or Canvas Conference at the secondary level) on a consistent basis.

Also, it is important for you to note that we continue to update our [eLearning Expectations document](#) to reflect minor changes as we learn and grow from the implementation of our eLearning plan. Here are some reminders and additional details relating to our expectations relating to Zoom practices, grading, and grading scales.

ZOOM/CANVAS CONFERENCE GUIDELINES AND EXPECTATIONS

While there were very few problems this week with our Zoom and Canvas Conference sessions, we have adapted our guidelines and expectations to better meet our needs as a district. Here are some points that are important for all of you and your parents to remember.

- Zoom/Canvas Conference classes are intended for you, our students, and are our new “classroom”. It is important that you remain respectful and follow all classroom rules while engaging in your new classroom environment.
- Please remember recording of any Zoom sessions is strictly prohibited.
- Finally, please only display your real name during class meetings, and remember that you are only to enter meetings that you are scheduled to enter.

GRADES AND GRADING SCALES

Another point of refinement deserves mentioning in relation to grading. Our eLearning Expectations document lists a general grading scale, however, pluses and minuses may or may not apply at different levels. If you have any questions about the grading scale, questions should be directed to your teachers.

Also, please note that Home Access has now been modified to reflect an “I” for Incomplete rather than an “F” for the letter grade in accordance with our eLearning plan. All incompletes are required to be resolved in order to receive a grade and/or credit.

FOOD SUPPORT FOR THE COMING WEEK

ALPINE CHAPEL - 23153 W. Miller Rd, has a food pantry available from 9am-noon every Saturday. The food pantry WILL BE OPEN the week of Easter (Saturday, April 11th, 2020).

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL FOOD PANTRY - The food pantry WILL NOT BE OPEN the week of Easter (Thursday, April 9th, 2020). Please note, the Harvest Room Sunday evening dinners have been suspended indefinitely at this time.

MEAL ASSISTANCE FROM DISTRICT 95 - District 95 is providing bagged grab-and-go breakfast and lunches to families in need of meal assistance during the COVID-19 related school closures. *Even if you have never before demonstrated a need for such services, please know that if your situation has changed over the last several weeks and now you are in need, you may participate in our meal assistance program.*

- PICK-UP LOCATION: Lake Zurich High School – Door #12, on the west side of the building. Please enter via the main high school driveway and follow the signs.
- TIME: 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon
- PICK-UP DAYS: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays (**Note: Meals WILL be distributed on Friday April 10th despite it being a non-attendance day.** Both the meal pickup at the high school and the delivered meals will be offered as usual.)
- ELIGIBILITY: Children age 18 and under, and Special Education students age 21 and under.

On Mondays and Wednesdays, the District will provide 2 breakfasts and 2 lunches per child. On Fridays the District will provide 1 breakfast and 1 lunch per child. Families will be met at the curb and should not exit their vehicles.

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If you are unable to pick up the grab-and-go meals but would still like to receive meals, we are trying to offer delivery via a school bus drop off at your home. If circumstances allow for a home/neighborhood delivery, we need your information. Please have your parents follow the directions provided to them in the communication sent to them. Delivery is planned to take place from 10am to noon. If we are unable to complete home/neighborhood delivery, we will contact your parents.

Enjoy a restful weekend as we move into some warmer spring weather. While social distancing and Stay-at-Home orders still apply, hopefully this at least allows a bit of time outside for play and exercise. Keep working hard! We are all proud of you and want you to be successful!
