Kyle Kovach – Elementary School

- LENS Leadership Program – Mr. Kovach expressed his gratitude to the leadership of Legacy for the ongoing Leadership Training he has received over the last eight years. His current opportunity to participate in the LENS Leadership program is described as School Leadership Boot Camp with participation in the following activities/events.
 - Week of intense training in Boston last summer
 - One visit in Boston high performing schools Fall of 2018.

- Site visit from personal assigned coach
- Monthly coaching sessions with assigned projects and reviews throughout the year.
- Action Steps in moving teachers forward
 - Moving Teachers to Facilitators of Learning

 - 5th Grade Faculty has been visiting the 4th Grade scholars over the last few weeks. Scholars are already familiar with 5th grade teachers. Ongoing personal contact with families will be made in the coming weeks.
- 8th to 9th Grades – Middle to High School Event – February 26th
 - Mr. Hampton will attend this event tonight to introduce Ms. Smith to the rising 8th Grade scholars and families. The evening will provide information about Legacy Early College High School opportunities and introduction of High School Faculty.

LaCheryl Smith - High School

- Step-up Night for 8th to 9th Grade, February 26th
- Top 25 8th Grade families have already been contacted regarding Dual Credit opportunity at Legacy Early College High School.
 - Beginning of 2018-2019 – 25 dual credit scholars
 - Second semester for 2018-2019 – 70 dual credit scholars
 - Target number for Fall 2019-2020 - 100 dual credit scholars.
- Mr. Knox, Legacy To and Through College Director, has provided data regarding a strong correlation with College Success with scholars who have college credits at graduation.
- Dual Credit versus IB or AP Courses – at the end of IB/AP Courses, the scholar must take a required test with a grade of 3.0. If they do not make the required grade, they do not receive credit even though they spent the time to take the class. The Dual-Credit opportunity provides more guarantee of earning the college credit.
