Kyle Kovach – Elementary School

- Bridge Program – Spring to Fall
- Summer Academy-Goal is to get scholars to grade level
 - 4-Hour Intensive Reading for 6 weeks – Monday through Thursday-8:00-12:00
 - Small Group Reading

- 30 Scholars per grade level
- Staff will include an ESOL teacher and a Special Ed Teacher

Stephen Hampton – Middle School

- Goals for scholars are prepared for next year
 - Scholars will preview content for the upcoming grade level.
 - Scholars will have the option of a virtual summer school curriculum if they are unable to attend Legacy Summer School.
 - 35 scholars per grade 5th-7th
 - Targeting all 8th Graders
- Summer Academy – Previewing of content for the following year
 - 8th Graders – Two High School Teachers will be working with 8th Grade Teachers.
 - 8th Grade Math to Algebra 1
 - 8th Grade ELA to English 1

- Introduction of Michael Knox – Alumni Director
 - Senior Acceptance Luncheon, April 5th, 11:30-1:00 – invitation given to the Board Members
 - Clemson – Men of Color Summit
 - Dr. Roy Jones – Call Me Mister Program – Development of Males of Color for Middle School and Elementary School Teachers
 - Clemson is developing a course to partner with high schools that will provide college credit.
- LaCheryl Smith, LECHS Principal – working on Teacher Cadet Program
- Hispanic Alliance – Adela Mendoza shared about a program currently in 2 high schools advocating for DACA scholars for tuitions and scholarships.
