In English, our students develop an understanding of themselves and others through reading and writing, while advancing their communication skills for success in college and beyond. Students employ critical analysis of challenging literature and original source texts, as well as essential vocabulary and grammar skills throughout each course.

Curriculum Overview

World Literature & Composition (Grade 9) provides a foundation of study in all literary genres. Students hone their skills in literary analysis and writing, identifying literary devices and analyzing the writing styles of world authors and poets. Academic Levels: CP & Honors.

American Literature (Grade 10) curriculum traces the development of American writing from the oral storytelling of the Native Americans through the Puritans, the Age of Enlightenment, Romanticism and Modern 20th Century poetry and fiction. Academic Levels: CP & Honors.

British Literature (Grade 11) is a challenging curriculum that begins in the Anglo-Saxon Period followed by Medieval, Renaissance, Elizabethan, Restoration, Victorian and Modern 20th Century periods. Academic Levels: CP, Honors, & AP.

Senior English and Electives allow students to explore their interests more specifically through literature, creative analytical writing.
