

Find ten examples of forces in action around your home e.g. pulling the curtains. Design a poster, power point, take pictures or draw diagrams to present your forces.	Create your own mysterious island setting, just like the ones in Oliver and the Seawigs. Write a description of the setting to help the reader build up a picture of your island in their head
Plan to go on your own adventure to explore somewhere in the local area that you have never been before with your family - where will you go? What will you need to take? What will you do when you get there?	Make up a game for 7 year olds using forces (push, pull & twist). Provide written instructions for playing.	Find out about a famous person that came from Hastings or St Leonards. Create a fact file about them and why they are famous.
Find someone you know that has lived in Hastings or St Leonards for a long time and interview them. Ask them how life and the area has changed over time.	Make a poster or leaflet to advertise the current facilities in the local area. Do you or your grown ups know any that used to be here that no longer exist?	Design and make your own seawig. Try to use a range of resources and think about what seaside accessories you will add to make it interesting!
