









Year 2 Term 5 Home Learning Experiences for "Ocean Commotion".

Present your information in a fun and creative way!</p> 	<p>Make an Easter or Spring card to give to somebody in your household.</p> 	<p>Read 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson. There is also an animated version on BBC iplayer. Write a book review of the story.</p> 
<p>Create an underwater habitat in a shoebox or jam jar. Think about what you might see under the sea and what creatures you might find in different parts of the ocean.</p>	<p>Create your own shape patterns. These could also include colour. How complex can you make your patterns?</p> 	<p>Research the negative impacts of plastic in the world's oceans. Create a poster that encourages people to protect the ocean from plastic and rubbish.</p> 
<p>Name and locate all of the continents and oceans on a world map.</p> 	<p>Write a story about some of the sea creatures you have investigated and learnt about.</p> 	<p>Create a piece of art using recycled materials, like this ornament made out of tin cans.</p>
