Seven alumnae collectively repacked 28,280 pounds of pears for a total of 23,566 meals provided to Greater Chicago Food Depository partner organizations in Cook County at the Chicago Wellesley Club's spring community service event on March 23, 2019. Come throw on an apron and join us next time. The GCFD strives to end hunger in our community. They work with a network of more than 700 partner agencies and programs including food pantries, soup kitchens and shelter, and distribute 159,000 meals every day.



Join fellow alumnae for a tour of the interior of the newly renovated Unity Temple. "Unity Temple (1905-08) represents a defining moment in Frank Lloyd Wright's early career. Designed in Wright's Oak Park Studio for his own Unitarian congregation, it is one of the first public buildings in America to feature exposed concrete and is one of Wright's greatest public buildings of his Prairie Era. The harmony of the building's strikingly geometric architecture and decorative elements exemplifies Wright's theory of organic design."
