



Children's Online Privacy Protection Act Information

As we continue to deliver Haverford's distance learning program, we want to ensure that the proper online permissions and protections are in place for our students. Please follow these steps:

1. Review the information below regarding the Children's Online Protection Privacy Protection Act.
2. Look for an email from Andrea Drinkwine, Director of Information and Instructional Technology, on April 15 with a link to DocuSign.
3. Provide an electronic signature by April 30, 2020 in DocuSign to allow your child to access Haverford's online educational platforms. **Note:** While both parents of children ages 13 and under may receive this document, we only require one parent to sign and return for each child.

COPPA (Child Online Privacy Protection Act) requires developers of web-based tools and applications to obtain verifiable parental consent so that children under the age of 13 can use those products. You must provide consent so that your child can access these online educational services.

The Haverford School will be using DocuSign to obtain the needed consent. On *April 15, 2020*, you will receive an email from DocuSign on behalf of The Haverford School. This email will contain the COPPA consent form. Please follow the instructions in the email to provide consent for your child to use the online resources.
