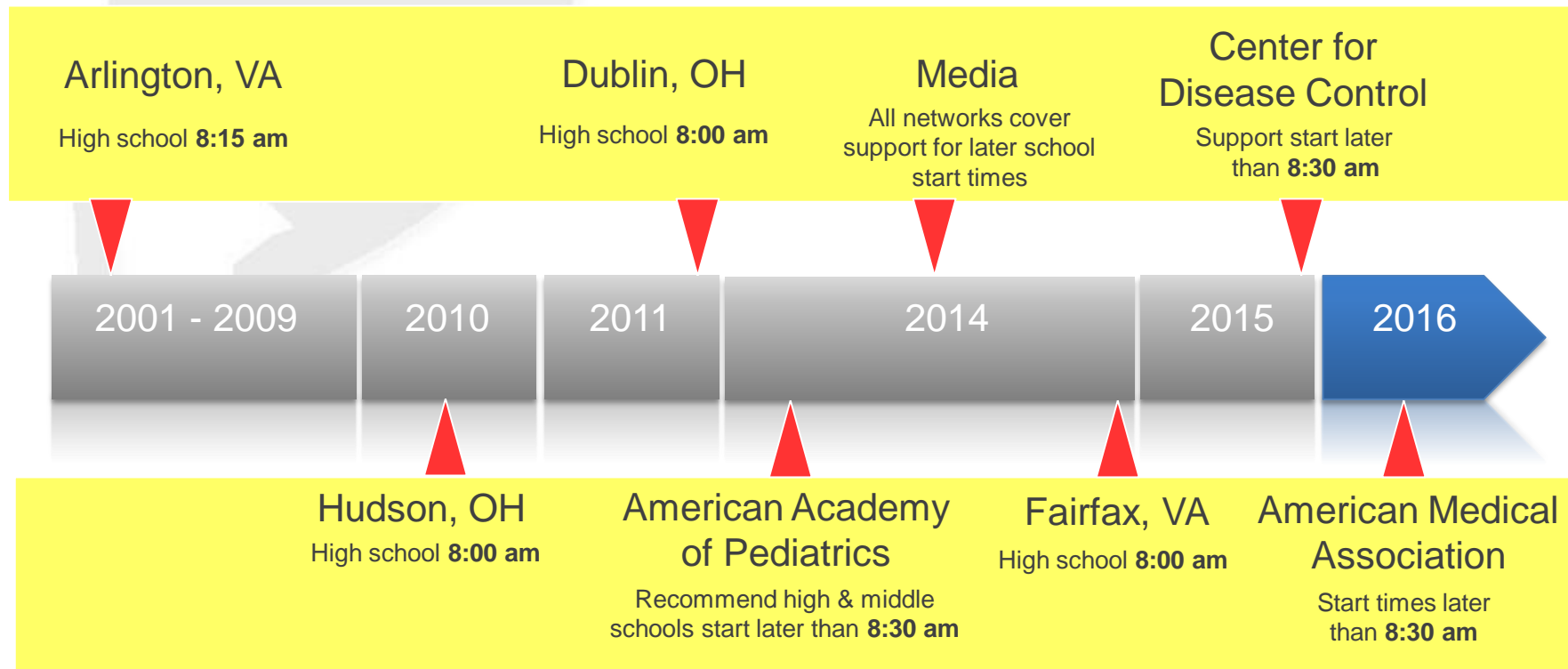
Objective

Olentangy Teacher Survey

- 59% of Olentangy teachers in early start buildings (before 8am) report students are less engaged first period than other students throughout the day.
- 84% of Olentangy teachers in early start buildings report first period students have less energy than other students throughout the day
- 54% of Olentangy teachers report they hear multiple students express that they are tired 4 or 5 days per week



**PROPOSALS TO CHANGE START TIMES
FOR 2017-18 AND BEYOND**

Proposal I – Elementary First

School Times	Additional buses	Additional Annual Operating Cost
ES 7:20-2:00 HS 8:00-3:05 MS 8:30-3:45	0 - 141 (\$0 - \$12.5M)	\$0 - \$7.2M

*Cost savings ideas include:

- Eliminating transportation for non-publics to free up 22 buses
- Reduce busing to state minimums which would eliminate high school busing and add zero cost for later start times

Proposal 2 – Start school day at 8:00am or later

School Times	Additional buses	Additional Annual Operating Cost
OHS, LHS, OOHS 8:00-3:15 HMS, SMS, OMS 8:20-3:25 LMS 8:45-3:50 BMS 8:50-3:55 ACES, ISES, OCES, SRES 9:30-4:10 All other ES 9:45-4:25	0	\$0

*Later HS Start Time satisfies recommendations from health experts

*Requires a negotiations with OTA to change the current language in CBA that workday ends by 4pm

Proposal 3 – Zero Period

School Times	Additional buses	Additional Annual Operating Cost
ES unchanged MS unchanged HS unchanged, but morning buses would arrive for 2 nd period (8:10)	32 (\$2.8M)	\$1.9M

*Later HS Start Time satisfies recommendations from health experts

*HS 1st period becomes “zero” period for any student that can provide his/her own transportation

*Requires additional cost because it reduces the distribution of times K-12 thereby reducing options for double/triple routing
