English language instruction educational programs facilitate the development and attainment of English proficiency and academic achievement of students whose native or first language is not English. Students receive instruction in social and academic English and appropriate support for learning academic content.

## Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment: February 4 - March 22, 2019

Students who are qualified in the English Language Learning (ELL) program will begin taking their annual assessments on February 4th. There are four parts to the test: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. Test sections will be given throughout February and March for each grade level. There are practice tests on the Ohio Department of Education's (ODE) website, if you would like your child to practice at home. We will receive the results from ODE in May and a family report will be mailed to your home. The results of this test are used to determine your child's ELL services for the 2019-2020 school year. Students who score "Proficient" on this assessment are exited from the ELL Program. If you have any questions about this assessment, please contact your child's ELL Teacher.

## **Elementary Families:**

Elementary ELL teachers recently sent home a Student Goals Report for English language acquisition. This progress report describes how your child is progressing with English language skills at a particular level. The goals were created based off of assessment data and information from a standardized screener or state language proficiency test. The current progress levels are based on skills we have observed in the classroom and/or skills in small group instruction. We communicate progress toward goals for Quarter 2 (January) and again in Quarter 4 (May). Our ELL Department is looking for <u>Bilingual Parent Volunteers</u>.
