## School Calendar:

On Tuesday evening, the Board of Education approved a calendar for the rest of the school year. It includes an additional day off for students and teachers (compensating for the original Primary Day) as well as three more professional learning days for teachers (or catch-up days for students). <u>You can see how this affects our day rotation calendar here.</u>

## **Information for Seniors:**

We know many are wondering about graduation, internship, prom, and many other events. Our dilemma is that if we start planning for a particular scenario and announce it to everyone, it pins everyone's hopes to something – and then we may find out a situation changes that would either make us cancel the plan or wish we had planned something different. Please understand that we are holding off on finalizing decisions until the picture is a bit more defined. The Board of Education has voted to make June 17 as the date of "Graduation." Board policy requires they decide on a graduation date at their April meeting. Whether we hold an actual ceremony on that date is still to be determined. We

have received many suggestions – and thank you for your responses to the survey. We do, however, need a date to enter on the diplomas and put into our final records, so for the class of 2020, June 17 will be that date.

Also, it is important for all seniors (and any student planning to leave Fairfield Public Schools), that you **migrate the contents of your school Google account to a personal Google account**. You never know when you need your papers and projects from high school to refer to in the future. You must do this before July, which is when all senior and outgoing student Google accounts are deleted. <u>Please refer to these instructions for migrating the contents of your Google Drive.</u>
