






| Whitetail Deer With Control of the C |
| Whitetail deer are land mammals that live in forests and grasslands. They are large animals that weigh about 110 to 300 pounds and they can run as fast as 35 miles per hour. The whitetail deer are named so because the underside of their tail is covered with white hair. Their fur is reddish during the summer, but in winter it changes to a gray-brown coat. Whitetail deer are herbivores, so they don't eat meat. They feed on blackberry bushes, acorns, clover, corn, and leaves. In winter, when the ground is covered in snow, they can eat the buds off the tree limbs or the bark of the trees. A male deer is called a buck and a female deer is called a doe. Bucks have two antlers on top of their head that fall off every late winter. The bucks' antlers will start growing again at a very rapid rate in spring. In summer, bucks live together in bachelor groups, while their antlers are still growing. In fall, when their antlers are fully grown, bucks use their antlers to defend against predators or to fight each other. |




