Your teachers continue to miss you and wish you well. We hope you enjoyed the past week's learning at home activities focused on Earth Week. It is so important to remember ways to care for our planet!



For the coming week, many of your activities will have to do with the season of spring. For example, in science you will be thinking about habitats. You will consider what the plants and animals living there need to survive and how those needs are met. You will also compare two different habitats to think of ways they are similar and different.

For reading and writing this week, we would like you to consider where you are choosing to work. You can watch some videos that describe how to choose "just right" reading and writing spots. You will review the skills of deciding how to read, taking a sneak peek, and planning your writing. Maybe you will even choose to read and write about spring!

In math, some of your thinking will be centered around chickens and eggs. You'll have opportunities to find patterns, solve word problems and explain your reasoning. By the way, you may need to know how many toes a chicken normally has. Do you? (The answer is four. Shhh... 4)
